It felt good making a good number of visits again. We're struggling the get the Thursday morning Bible studies back up and running after the 6-week hiatus for the Lenten services. Perhaps its structure needs some reworking. Also, we missed our Sunday adult Bible study this month because we needed to plan for new curriculum. The parent study finished back in March. We should be starting in with the new study in May.

All in all, a steady flow of ministry over the last month. I pray it remains this steady as we shift into summer mode over the next month.

# Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

March 16, 2016

#### I. Call to order

Chairperson Brian Nelson called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on March 16, 2016. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Brian Nelson, Jane Stokebrand, Randy Wollenburg, Lois Wattjes, Adam Wollenburg, and Joel Kaelin.

#### **II.** Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was presented. It was moved by Duane and seconded by Lois that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report was presented. It was moved by Joel and seconded by Randy that the report be approved.
- c) Investments Report: A balance of \$33,551.01 was reported as of Feb. 26, 2016. Mr. Steve Hovendick reported on our profile with Edward Jones Investment. He recommended to maintain our investment portfolio which is designed to minimize volatility.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: Balance of Memorial Fund to date is \$19,269.93.
- f) Suggestion Box: None available.
- g) Committee Reports:
  - 1. Social Committee had no new report.
  - 2. Worship Committee reported on a request by that committee to retain some palm branches from Palm Sunday to be made into ashes for next year's Ash Wednesday service. Holy week services will include a 7:00 P.M. service on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday service at 8:00 P.M. Easter sunrise service at 7:30 A.M. followed by an Easter breakfast served by the youth group. Easter communion service will follow at 10:00 A.M. The worship committee requested that church council members assist with stripping the altar following the Maundy Thursday service. Members agreed to perform that task.
  - 3. Parish Education and Youth Group Ministries reported on the Noah group which will be providing the VBS program this summer. VBS will be held on a Monday through Friday schedule from 8:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. A paid position of site coordinator is needing to be filled. Next, there was discussion regarding advertising in the bulletin and News Letter for members to serve as Youth Group Leaders. Finally, it was discussed that the job description for the elected position of Sunday School Superintendent should be updated.
  - 4. Property Committee suggested exploring the possibility of having the floors in the church professionally waxed prior to the Fiftieth Anniversary Celebration. Action was tabled until the next meeting.

#### **Old Business**

- a) Brian will contact Jordan Isaacson with Brotherhood Insurance to confirm action on the insurance coverage changes approved at the December meeting.
- b) Members have been notified of the option to receive the News Letter as an email if they desire. If members do not designate this choice of delivery, they will continue to receive a paper copy by postal service.

- c) There was discussion regarding the purchase of a fax machine to be used in the church office. There was a motion by Randy and a second by Adam to purchase a fax machine. The motion carried.
- d) The church and piano are currently being used by an individual to provide piano lessons. After investigation of insurance issues it was determined that the lesson provider be required to submit a Facilities Use Agreement form to protect Trinity Lutheran Church from any financial liability.
- e) The basement windows for the parsonage have not yet been completed. After discussion it was decided to rebid the project for two functional windows and one egressed window, as well as, two non-opening windows and one egressed window. In addition, bids for construction of basement walls will be let.

#### III. New Business

- (a) There was discussion of the need for an internet upgrade. This item is tabled for consideration at next month's meeting.
- (b) Following a discussion of the Youth Summer Camp program, there was a motion by Duane and a second by Adam to contribute \$150 per student for summer camp attendance after the student has contributed the initial registration portion of payment. The motion carried. As of this meeting, one student is interested in Summer Camp.
- (c) Pastor Koos will change the format of the Parent Study Group which is held the first Sunday of the month to an Adult Education group.
- (d) Following discussion there was a motion by Adam and a second by Lois to retain some palms from the Palm Sunday service to be used for next year's Ash Wednesday service. The motion carried.
- (e) Following discussion it was decided to investigate the purchase of a piano for use in the balcony area.
- (f) Brian presented a sample of the Fiftieth Year Anniversary pamphlet which was mailed to former pastors, the bishop, and family members of former pastors.
- (g) It was noted that information was received regarding Pastor Kramer's 50th year since ordination. Information will be posted on the bulletin board.

Adjournment: There was a motion by Adam and a second by Randy to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, Pastor Koos led the group praying the Lord's Prayer. The next council meeting will be held on April 20<sup>th</sup> at 8 P.M.
