#### Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

February 15, 2017

#### I. Call to order

Chairperson Duane Wollenburg called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on February 15, 2017. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Lois Wattjes, Joel Kaelin, Brian Scherling, Yvonne Rahe, Byron Beerenstrauch, Cody Wollenburg, and Amy Stokebrand

#### Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was read. Yvonne made a motion and it was seconded by Byron that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$22,086.04 as of January 31, 2017. The available cash balance is \$13,676.85. Yvonne made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Joel. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: no report was given.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: The memorial balance is reported to be \$17,455.75 as of January 31, 2017.
- f) Suggestion Box: There was a letter submitted that 1) the policy should be changed that each letter must be signed that is included in the suggestion box to get more suggestions made. The council values everyone's opinions and we want to hear everyone's concerns but we still need to have each letter signed. The council will not publish the person's name so all parishioners should feel that they can let us know their concerns. 2) there were concerns about members transferring out of the church and the council discussed.
- g) Committee Reports:
  - 1. Social Committee reported that the next event will be the card party on Feb. 26th.
  - 2. Worship Committee met on Feb. 1st. They suggested that the church could purchase Catechism Books to give out to each household to focus on the upcoming Reformation Sunday. Lois made motion and Yvonne seconded. Motion carried. Pastor has a schedule to focus on the preaching of the Catechism for the next 10 months. He will take the 2st Sunday of each month to focus on these teachings: March-10 Commandments, part 1, April-10 Commandments, part 2, May-Apostles' Creed, June-Lord's Prayer, July-Baptism, August-Lord's Supper, September-Confession/Forgiveness, October-Blessings. Praise Choir will now do a new song every 3 months instead of every month. Pastor Cathy Burchett and Mary Garrison will be holding the Lenten services. The teachings will be: Week 1-"Behold, the Lamb of God", Week 2-The Lamb who Takes our Place", Week 3- "The Lamb Who Redeems Us From Slavery", Week 4- "The Passover Lamb of Whom We Partake", Week 5-"The Triumphant Lamb We Worship". The Communion Class will be starting on March 12th from 4-5:00pm for the 5th Graders. Discussion was had about starting Saturday evening services. Pastor will send out in the next newsletter if there is any interest in Saturday evening services and if so, what times and frequency.
  - Evangelical Committee. Lois will determine with Pastor what this committee would focus on.
  - 4. Parish Education: No report
  - 5. Youth Group: In June the youth group will be going to Pine Ridge with First Trinity Lutheran Church and the Methodist church youth groups. The group is asking the church to pay \$146 of the \$296 total per child towards this trip. The council would like to know how many are committed to going and if they will be doing a fundraiser to help. Brian

- made a motion to table the discussion until the next meeting. Byron seconded it. Motion carried.
- 6. Property Committee: Darcy Baker purchased the TV for the Youth Group room and needs help to get that attached to the wall. Brian will look into it.

#### II. Old Business

a) The Council discussed the three applicants for the Church Secretary position. After much discussion, the council voted on Jenn Uher for the position.

#### III. New Business

- (a) Tom Koch cannot usher in December when he was assigned. Duane said he would rework the schedule.
- (b) Pastor reported that the confirmation class will be going to a conference in Omaha on Feb. 17 & 18th. Four confirmands will be going with Pastor and Kerri Thornburg.
- (c) Pastor asked to get his Microsoft Office License renewed for the next year for \$70.
- (d) Pastor reported that last month when he said that our Constitution needed revisions, he was mistaken, it was the Synod's Constitution and not ours, so we are fine.
- (e) Pastor reported that he had talked to Pastor Travis in Wilber about the e-giving thru Thrivent. Pastor Travis reported that it works very well in their church. A motion was made to go ahead and have Pastor signup for this program if the administrative fees not exceed \$300 yearly. Yvonne made the motion and Byron seconded it. Motion carried.
- (f) Pastor reported that he would like to take the confirmation class to summer camp at Carol Joy Holling. It would be July 23-27. It was agreed the church would pay \$100 towards the registration fee and each confirmand would be responsible for the rest.
