Secretary: Minutes were approved.

Treasurer: \$24,156.68 as of 11/19/14, Approved. Investment: \$35,745.92 as of 11/19/14

Pastors Report: Pastor Koos has had a busy month consisting of the following: 4 Confirmation classes, led 3 Bible studies, 14 visits to Hospitalized and shut in members, 4 text studies, 1 baptism, 2 youth group meetings, led in a service at Beatrice Good Samaritan Center and a service at the Wilber Care Center, officiated over 1 wedding.

Social: Tim said on January 18th they are planning a Pitch tournament and will be inviting area churches. On February 15th they will be organizing a trip to see a Nebraska Woman's basketball game.

Parish Ed: Tv's with DVD players have been purchased by the Sunday School for each Sunday School class room.

Property: Lois and Larry Wattjes have transplanted some of the plants from the parsonage to the Church, and they will be taking care of these, a big Thanks to them for doing this. The thermostat in the first few classrooms and the restrooms is extremely hot and don't seem to be working right. Chris will take care of having someone take a look at this.

Old Business:

Candy Sacks for Sunday School: Motion was made by Jessi, 2nd by Brad for the offering on the first Sunday in December to go to the Sunday School for money for the Candy Sacks, motion passed.

5 Year Plan: It was brought up that we look into doing some handicap pews, possibly in the middle sections of the pews in the future.

Video System: We have been looking into a Video System (projector and screen) for the front of the Church. We can get the cost close to \$10,000 and we have been contacted by an individual who is willing to pay for this entire project. Motion by Chuck, 2nd by Chris to go ahead with the Video System Project, motion passed. Hopefully we can have this project competed after the first of the year.

Website: Is up and going, there have been pictures added and Sermons are available on there also.

Praise Choir: Pastor reported that they are still in the process of getting things worked out, they will look at a few less songs and go from there.

Credit Card: We will be getting a credit card thru the bank for Pastor to use when ordering materials etc.

Kirchoff Benefit: \$2297.00 was raised at the joint Service with Soap Creek. Pastor will take the check to them.

New Business:

Constitution Update: Pastor presented a letter he received from the Synod Attorney regarding the Bylaws to our Constitution. He stated that our Bylaws have not been approved because they do not agree with the Constitution. Pastor and Tim will check into what we need to do to get this corrected and go from there.

Ushers & Greeters List: Chris will come up with a list for next year.

Budget: Chris, Tim, Jenn and Pastor will work on this.

Middle School Gathering: Pastor will be taking 9 of the 12 Confirmation students to a retreat on January 17th and 18th.

Annual Meeting will be held January 25th after Church Service.

December Meeting/Christmas Party will be December 10th and Tim Garrisons at 6:30 p.m.

Motion by Chuck, 2nd by Larry to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
