Pastor's Report March 2015

Do you mean to tell me that spring officially kicks off in a couple days? When did winter come through? The last 3 months have felt like spring weather to me. I've said it before but I can't help but reiterate it—my family and I *gladly* welcome this Nebraska weather. We consider these mild temperatures a true blessing.

Of course, we consider our congregation a truer blessing. The ministry has kept me plenty busy in the last 3 weeks since we gathered as a council. The weekly home visitations have gone into full swing and I'm pleased to have been able to make 11 visits with the hospitalized, shut-in, and regular members. I led 3 Sunday worship services including a praise service, 1 chapel service at Good Samaritan, and 1 chapel service at Wilber Care Center. I participated in and colled 6 Lenten services with our Episcopal and Methodist brothers and sisters in Christ. These services have forced our weekly Thursday morning Bible studies to be placed on hold until after Lent. I was able to make it to 1 pastors' text study. I taught 1 parent study group, 2 fifth grade communion classes, and 3 confirmation classes including one in which we made care packages for our military members. I was especially rejuvenated by the "World Day of Prayer" service held at the neighboring Methodist church.

I want to extend my gratitude for allowing me to take advantage of 2 professional enhancements. The 2-day conference on rural ministry in Dubuque, IA gave me some useful wisdom to incorporate in our shared ministry. Also, the wisdom gained from the training on marriage counseling will be put to good use in the months ahead as I walk with a couple preparing to marry this upcoming fall. I am confident both training sessions will prove invaluable. Thank you!

The meeting was called to order by chairman, Chris Woerner. Pastor led in devotions.

Duane Wollenburg opened meeting with discussion about screen/projector. He thinks we should get a larger screen and the company is willing to provide a larger screen depending on whether the Crete public schools can use the current screen. He said we can get a hidden aluminum frame for an extra \$500 but the council unanimously voted (6-0) to keep solid, black frame. Duane also said he will remount the projector onto a beam overhanging the balcony because of the vibrations.

Pastor's: see included report. Pastor brought up vacation the week of 06/01-06/08, a Rural Ministry conference (03/01-03/03), Prepare/Enrich training (03/10), Festival of Homiletics (05/11-05/15), and summer camp (07/05-07/10) with 1 participant interested (cost=\$390). Will discuss funding camp.

Suggestion box: none

Social: positive feedback from UNL women's basketball event on 02/15. Will discuss scheduling spring golf tournament at next month's meeting.

Property: had a representative from Ratigan Schottler come to see pews and give an estimate on refinishing. Unfortunately because they are veneer, the rep didn't recommend refinishing them. The rep will work up an estimate for re-upholstering them. He said the cost to shorten pews for handicap accessibility is \$250/pew. Suggested possibly using "Amish Glow" or a similar shine on the pews. Got prices for replacing faucets in kitchen, will present to WELCA to discuss. Also noted a cracked pew on the east side of the center aisle that possibly needs to be replaced.

Retirement plan: Chris and pastor enrolled in plan with Portico. First bill in March will be high to reflect back payments.

New Business

New Tablet: We need to shop around for prices on a new Microsoft Surface Pro for running projector.

Funeral Memorials: We need a volunteer willing to monitor this during funerals.



Electronic Recycling/Data Shredding Event!


The Beatrice Holy Cross Confirmation Class will be hosting an Electronics Recycling Event Saturday, April 11th from 10am to 1pm.
