Not that a nagging sickness can keep this pastor from meeting all the demands of the ministry here at Trinity! We made it through our first shared Easter celebration and I'm quite pleased with how smoothly it went. We even managed to give 1<sup>st</sup> communion to five 5<sup>th</sup> graders on Maundy Thursday following a 5-week class. Including the 4 Easter weekend services, I managed to lead 7 worship services in the last month. I also led services for our Episcopalian neighbors and the Good Samaritan Center in Beatrice, not to mention a couple Lenten services. We were unable to hold our parent study group this month since it fell on Easter Sunday and we were wrapped up with congregational breakfast. The Lenten services had put our weekly Thursday Bible studies on hold and we should be getting to them this week. I did teach 3 confirmation classes, 1 youth group, and participated in 3 text studies. I was able to make 13 visits on our shut-in, hospitalized, and member households. Finally, we gathered for 1 committee meeting.

We'll be shifting into summer mode around the church in the next month. Formal Sunday school classes will be coming to an end but I'll try to gather the kids for informal classes through the 3-month summer break. Shifting gears does *not* mean checking out! Please keep your church community in mind as you make plans.

Greetings from your pastor and partner in ministry!!

As the Sunday school and confirmation classes wind down before the 4-month summer break, I got to thinking about the overall shift in tempo of our congregational life. Families with children will get consumed with sports in no time. Many of us will try to squeeze our vacations in while the weather is good. Work schedules will fluctuate to accommodate these changes in the daily and weekly routines. There will be a great temptation to check out of church life altogether during the months ahead. I ask you NOT to give in to the temptation! Your involvement in our church is crucial to its strength. We need you to stay connected but more importantly we want you to poke your head in the church doors every once in a while.

Though our kids are checking out of their classes, the ministries will remain alive and vibrant through the summer months. We'll *still* be kicking off worship services each month with a praise service so keep showing up for practice, praise choir members. We'll *still* be gathering on the first Sunday of each month for our parent study group and every Thursday morning for our Bible studies, adult learners. We've developed a good momentum to help get us through the months ahead until the kids return to classrooms.

Not that we want to dismiss the kids from our church life! I also did some thinking on how to entice them back into church. We're going to try something a little different with our Vacation Bible School. Rather than the typical 3-day run during the 1st week of July, we're going to space VBS out over the 4 months. We invite the children to come during the usual learning hour before Sunday service on the fourth Sunday of each month (05/24, 06/28, 07/26, & 08/23) for games and activities. The kids will offer a performance during service following their gatherings. It WON'T be Sunday school...it'll be summer fun spread out through the summer break! Let's give it a try and see if the kids like it. We can always come back to the typical 3-day run next summer.

Also, please keep in mind the Memorial Day weekend cookout/potluck that my family and I will be hosting on Sunday, 05/24 at the parsonage. We will be setting up games and activities all over the yard for kids to participate in. All members are invited to share in some outdoor food and fellowship at our place. Please bring your lawn chairs and/or blankets though.

Finally, we're losing a good family this month that has played a special part in our shared ministry—the McCain family. Troy and Kim graciously led our youth group for several years, a role that is not an easy task. Just ask any parent of a teenager!! Their humble and generous service will be greatly missed and I invite you all to wish them well as they set out on their next adventure. Thank you!
