Greetings from your pastor and partner in ministry!!

Last month I had the privilege of presiding at the funeral for one of our members' father. The family asked me to lift up the wisdom of the 3rd chapter of Ecclesiastes. What a rich passage to pull from! It doesn't come up in the lectionary so we pastors rarely get an opportunity to preach on it. Yet it's one of those passages we often hear in the songs and speeches of popular culture. Let us recall the wisdom:

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance, a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing, a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.

Yes, it is an appropriate passage to lift up at the time of a person's death. But what about all the other seasons of a person's life? What about the times of searching and giving up? What about the times of tearing and mending? There are many seasons in our lives that also deserve lifting up.

Over the last couple months, our small community became intimately aware of nature's seasons too. The rains came and filled our fields, our streets, and our basements. Now nature didn't have a problem with us. It was simply adhering to its seasonal rhythms. Believe it or not, we were in the springtime rainy season! Nature was doing what it was supposed to do, when it was supposed to do it. We mustn't get angry with God's creation despite the temptation to do just that.

Though our summer chore and challenge has become drying out our fields and our basements, Ecclesiastes reminds us that we are in yet another season, a post-disaster season. Nature has torn down what we built up and now we must rebuild. It has been a time of keeping and now it is a time of throwing away. It has been a time of planting and not it is a time to replant...and replant. Every so often we need to be reminded that God's creation is majestic and awesome in all its seasonal glory.

Though we have shifted into the summer season with its slowed tempo, there are a few congregational events this month that we should keep in mind. Our annual 4th of July community service will be held here at Trinity on Sunday, July 5, followed by a cookout meal. There will be a pool party on Saturday, July 11 from 8:00-10:00 p.m. that all members are invited to participate in. The following morning, July 12, we will have another joint service held at St. Paul's Lutheran church (Soap Creek) followed by a potluck meal. On the last Sunday, July 26, we will have our semi-annual meeting following the service. Three out of the four Sundays will be rich with unusual activities.

Please continue holding each other in prayer as we are not quite out of our season of flood clean-up. I will hope to see you around the church in between sports and county fairs.
