Greetings from your pastor and partner in ministry!!

Our kids have returned to the classroom and many of our homes have returned to school-year routines by now. Though the transition was disruptive for some, most homes eventually run smoother and more efficiently once the kids have structured lives again. So as much grumbling as our kids give us, as much more stressful our kids become with homework and extracurricular activities, be assured that these seasons of learning are best for everyone.

We also enter into a new season of learning here at Trinity this month. The congregation will sing this song as the gathering hymn for the remaining Sundays of the month. This schedule should better familiarize us with the unknown songs.

If your household is anything like ours, you'd know it's been a busy a couple weeks scrambling to get kids prepared and readjusted to the school year scheduling. What a relief it has been to send all 3 of our girls to the same school though. For one year, our girls get to breath the same school air and see each other if only out of the corner of their eyes. Oh, what a blessing!

Likewise, ministry is also starting to pick up again after the summer break. I'm checking in with 4 of our 6 committees that don't meet monthly and assessing which services worked last year and which need adapting. The semi-annual meeting at the end of July similarly served to reflect on the prior 6 month's ministry for guiding the future 6 month's ministry. I managed to squeeze in a vacation to attend a family wedding up in Wisconsin that was greatly appreciated. Thank you for letting my family and I get away. Otherwise, the month's ministry was fairly regular: 2 Bible studies, 15 home/hospital visits, 4 text studies, 4 worship services including 2 praise services and 1 baptism, 6 committee meetings including one for DART (DeWitt Area Recovery Team), 1 vacation Bible school session, and both chapel services at the Wilber Care and Good Samaritan centers. I was blessed with the opportunity to get out, survey some homes in town, and hear firsthand the lingering recovery struggles. Our town may look back to normal, people may have reestablished familiar routines, but the recovery is far from over. Let us continue to hold each other in prayer and give thanks for all the outside relief that will slowly trickle in in the weeks and months ahead.

July 15, 2015

I. Call to order

Vice-chairman Brian Nelson called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on July 15, 2015. Pastor Koos led devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Chris Woerner, Brian Nelson, Darin Mahloch, Larry Pieper, Jane Stokebrand, Randy Wollenburg, and Chuck Holtmeier

II. Reports

- Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was presented. It was moved by Darin and seconded by Larry that the minutes be approved. Motion carried
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly report indicates a balance of \$9,923.77 as of July 15, 2015. There was a motion and a second to approve the treasurer's report. Report was approved
- c) Investment: Report indicates a balance of \$37,300.29 which is a decrease over last month's balance.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report indicates a balance of \$15,042.94.
- f) Committee Reports:
 - 1. Social Committee reported hosting of the pool party with 20 people present
 - Worship Committee had no new report.
 - Youth Development reported completion of two VBS services with two to follow. Youth Group Ministry one student and Pastor Koos attending Carol Joy Holling summer camp, also Pastor Koos sponsored 5 confirmands at Mahoney State Park.
 - 4. Stewardship/Finance/Budget had no new reports
 - 5. Property Committee reported an estimate from Terminex for \$1,000 for an application to eradicate the mole issue at the parsonage. Property Committee will pursue other approaches. Brian reported further information regarding lawn mowing at the parsonage. Mark Roessler offered to mow the parsonage lawn at a rate of \$55. This option will be implemented while consideration of a long range resolution to the mowing is pursued.

Suggestion Box: There was a question regarding the amount of money raised for the Back Pack Program by the golf outing. That amount was \$386 after expenses.

III. Old Business

- a) The Semi-Annual Meeting will be held July 26, 2015 following the Sunday service .
- b) Brotherhood Mutual, the flood insurance provider for the church, will be contacted regarding the remainder of the payment for flood damage.

IV. New Business

- (a) Pastor Koos requested and was granted vacation time to be taken October 9, 20115 through October 14, 2015.
- (b) Pastor has scheduled four out of six committee meetings to be held in the month of August.
- (c) The process of the Constitutional update is continuing. Input from Rev. Timothy Bernard has provided examples from a model constitution to guide us. A meeting of the council member will be held July 22, 2015 to review and discuss the information.

Adjournment: There was a motion by Randy and a second by Chuck to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried

Lord's Prayer: In conclusion of the meeting, Pastor led the group in The Lord's Prayer. Next Council Meeting: August 19th at 8:00 pm.
