God is much fuller than our lives no matter how important we claim they are. Our lives are as busy as God allows them to be and even then, just imagine how busy God's life is! You want to talk about trying to juggle too many things?! You want to talk about not having enough time to do all that needs to be done?! God juggles an infinite number of things and all within the allotted time. Of course, God also operates outside of time but now we're splitting hairs. If God can meet deadlines with an infinite number of tasks, then surely you and I can work to meet a limited number of tasks in our allotted time. And be grateful to God for giving us such rich lives! This month let us prepare for the busy Advent/Christmas season by finding the time to simply be still and revel in the awesome fullness of God.

I suppose the farmers have been asking themselves this very question as they've finally gotten out in the fields to harvest. The scramble is on to get the crop taken in. It helps to be blessed with unseasonably warm temps this month.

Though the farmers are scrambling, the ministry seems around Trinity seems to be going equally quick. Since last we met, I was able to make 12 visits, participate in 3 pastor's text studies (lead 2 of them here at Trinity), lead 3 Bible studies, teach 3 confirmation classes, lead 4 worship services, lead 1 chapel service, teach 1 parent study group, participate in 1 committee meeting, perform 2 baptisms, and lead 1 youth group gathering. The annual tailgate party at the Tri-County schools was another success. I also touched base with the area pastors at a meeting at Tri-County schools. We help a special congregational meeting to vote on the newest edition of the constitution and send it up to the synod level for approval and blessing. I officiated at 1 funeral and 1 wedding. I attended a 3-day theological conference in Kearney, NE. It's amazing I was able to squeeze in a week vacation to visit family and friends! Thank you for letting me get away and celebrate a good friend's wedding and reconnect with family.

Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

September 16, 2015

I. Call to order

Chairman Chris Woerner called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on September 16, 2015. Pastor Koos led devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Chris Woerner, Brian Nelson, Darin Mahloch, Jane Stokebrand, Randy Wollenburg, and Larry Pieper

II. Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was presented. It was moved by Darin and seconded by Larry that the minutes be approved. Motion carried
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly report indicates a balance of \$ 9,107.38 as of September 16, 2015. Report was reviewed and approved
- c) Investment: Report indicates a balance of \$35,032 which is a decrease over last month's balance.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report indicates a balance of \$16,045.54 as of September 16, 2015.
- Suggestion Box: Four signed entries were received and discussed.
 - 1. It was suggested that the acolyte be seated in the first pew to view the screen and be more included in the service. The suggestion will be implemented on a trial basis.
 - There was a suggestion to decrease the number of bulletins ordered and printed. Council
 agreed to reduce the number from 150 to 125 per service with consideration given to
 services that might require additional bulletins.
 - 3. There was a suggestion regarding the miscellaneous category in the budget. An increase in the miscellaneous expenses has been noted over the last few months due to flood expenses. The council decided that any item over \$500 be noted as a line item expense.
 - 4. There was a suggestion to have Bibles available for worshippers. Bibles will be made available in the back of the church. Please see an usher for help locating them.

g) Committee Reports:

- Social Committee will be hosting the Tri County Tailgate party on September 18th.
- Worship Committee reported positive comments on the use of the continuous line for communion.
- Parish Education and Youth Group Ministries reported the conclusion of this year's VBS program as well as the Sunday School Kick Off event hosted in September.
- 4. Stewardship/Finance/Budget report addressed the budget item of miscellaneous to consider a payment over \$500 be entered as an independent line item.
- Property Committee reported that the insurance adjuster determined damage to the
 parsonage roof, but only superficial damage to the church roof not indicating
 replacement. Following finalization of the insurance report roofers will be contacted for
 bids.

6. Old Business

a) Constitution revision update is available on line and hard copies will be placed in the back of the church. A congregational meeting will be held October 18, 2015 to determine if the congregation approves the proposed changes. If approved the document will be forwarded to the synod for review. b) Installation of handicapped pews was discussed. There was a motion by Randy and a second by Brian to contact Ratigan Shottler to install four handicapped pews at the original quote of \$250 per pew. The motion carried.

III. New Business

- (a) Roof damage to the parsonage, insurance payment, and pursuit of a roofer as discussed under the Property Committee report.
- (b) There was a motion by Darin and a second by Randy to reimburse Pastor Koos for the reverse osmosis system in the parsonage. The motion carried.
- (c) Pastor Koos requested and was granted vacation for October 9, 2015 through October 16, 2015. A replacement pastor is being pursued.
- (d) The Fall Coat Drive will be held at Trinity Lutheran on October 17th and 18th. Clean coats with working closures may be donated after September 1st and hung in the designated section of the coat rack.
- (e) A date for the joint congregational service including Trinity Lutheran and Soap Creek church is yet to be determined.

Adjournment: There was a motion by Randy and a second by Larry to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried.

Lord's Prayer: In conclusion of the meeting, Pastor led the group in The Lord's Prayer.

Next Council Meeting: October 21st at 8:00 pm. Communion Assistant for September is Larry.
