With the harvest season upon us, I am reminded of the 6th verse of Psalm 67--"The earth has yielded its increase; God, our God, has blessed us." The May/June flooding created quite a challenge for most everyone in our town. The large amount of water either hit our basements or the surrounding fields. We've focused primarily on recovering our basements these last 4 months while our farmers have struggled with planting and replanting. There are many fields that are still quite green, an abnormality for this time of year. Over the next few weeks, our farmers will reap their crops and will see just how hard they were hit. Please hold them in prayer, asking God to bless them with increase.

Our farmers will be putting in long hours and the ministry will be particularly enriching this month. Two of our members will be committing their lives to each other through marriage on the first weekend. Our Praise Choir will also be introducing Paul Baloche's song, "Above All," as this month's "hymn-of-the-month" that weekend. We sang last month's song, "10,000 Reasons," pretty well by the end of the month. Don't be surprised when we bring it back in May 2016. We will welcome new members into our congregation with a reception following the service on the third weekend. On the fourth weekend, we will be celebrating the 498th year since the church's Reformation began...just 2 years away from the big 500th anniversary. I will be taking my 3rd week of vacation from 10/09-10/16 and the council and I have asked Rev. Ken Kramer to come back and lead service on 10/11. Please welcome him with your special graciousness and generosity. I will be attending our synod's fall theological conference up in Kearney, NE from 10/18-10/21. Not before we have our special congregational meeting after service on 10/18 to discuss the constitutional revisions. We will then send the revised edition of the constitution up to the synod to get feedback.

God, our God, has indeed blessed us! Not just our farmers but all of our workers, non-workers, retirees, parents, children, students, teachers, singers, elderly, shut-ins, and sick. We are ALL enriched by God's abundant blessings from day to day. Let us be a blessing to all those we interact with this month.

I was greatly pleased to see such strong participation in the alternative 4-Sunday VBS structure this summer. Next summer I want to explore both the 4 Sundays and a 3-day midsummer VBS class. I hope the 3-day session won't pull participation away from the 4 Sundays but I missed seeing kids from the larger DeWitt community. Of course, we will need more leaders from the congregation to help make it a success. We'll explore this possibility in the spring.

As mentioned above, I did hold an orientation for the confirmation class as well as teach our first class. Recall that last summer we opened up the class to 6th graders. This year there were 5 eligible students but they've all chosen to wait and start the class next year. It was good to get back into Chip Ingram's teaching on how to be more effective parents. His wisdom on parenting is invaluable. It was unfortunate losing Kenny Hager but we rejoice that his 5 years of suffering came to an end. It was a blessing to lead worship at our neighboring Episcopal congregation after a 4-month break while they recovered from the May flooding. Finally, it is always a treat to re-connect with my fellow 1st-call pastors up at the Carol Joy Holling Center. I always come away refreshed with new ministry ideas and collegiality. Thank you for letting me get away.

Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

August 19, 2015

I. Call to order

Chairman Chris Woerner called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on August 19, 2015. Pastor Koos led devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Chris Woerner, Brian Nelson, Darin Mahloch, Jane Stokebrand, Randy Wollenburg, Adam Wollenburg, and Chuck Holtmeier.

II. Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was presented. It was moved by Darin and seconded by Brian that the minutes be approved as amended. Motion carried
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly report indicates a balance of
- \$ 13,859.16 as of August 19, 2015. There was a motion by Randy and a second by Adam to approve the treasurer's report. Report was approved
- c) Investment: Report indicates a balance of \$37,133.50 which is a decrease over last month's balance.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report indicates a balance of \$15,440.09 as of August 19, 2015.
- f) Suggestion Box: No entries.
- g) Committee Reports:
 - 1. Social Committee will be meeting August 25th to discuss ongoing activities.
 - 2. Worship Committee reported the Sunday School Kick Off scheduled for September 13th.
 - Parish Education and Youth Group Ministries indicated the last VBS session to be held in August.
 - 4. Stewardship/Finance/Budget had no new reports
 - 5. Property Committee reported one outstanding bill for material to seal the parsonage floor.

III. Old Business

- a) Constitution revision update included the addition of a treasurer to the Church Council while retaining the position of staff treasurer. This change is related to compliance with the model constitution, as well, as providing for an official liaison between the Church Council and the staff secretary. There was a motion by Adam and a second by Darin to approve the revised constitution for presentation to the congregation. The motion carried. The revised constitution is available on the church website and printed copies will be made available.
- b) There was a report that the DART surveys have been returned. There was a request that Trinity Lutheran be available for conducting the required interviews beginning August 19th.
- c) As of August 19th the WiFi system is working properly.

IV. New Business

(a) The worship and music committee requested updates to the sound system. After discussion the council determined that minor updates can be researched at this time with further sound system updates to be placed on the five year program.

- (b) Pastor will be holding the fall session of the New Member Class on September 20th and 27th, and October 4th and 18th. With October 18th being the induction ceremony.
- (c) Rev. Timothy Bernard, who has assisted us with the constitution revision, has suggested a monetary gift to the Youth Group at his church. Council held discussion, but did not make a decision.
- (d) There was a suggestion from the Worship Committee to try the continuous line for dispensation of communion. There was a motion by Randy and a second by Chuck to try that for the August 30th service. The motion carried.
- (e) Worship Committee also suggested a Hymn of the Month which will be implemented during the September Praise Choir Service.
- (f) September 13th will be the Sunday School Kick Off and distribution of Bibles.
- (g) Confirmation class will be resuming. Sixth grade parents who have replied indicate they will wait until next year to enroll their students.
- (h) Other new business included a report of three transfers out of Trinity Lutheran to include Troy and Kim McCain, Pastor Ken and Alona Kramer, and Bryce and Hannah Simpson family. Additionally Tim Garrison presented a request by Holy Cross Lutheran Church of Beatrice to assist with flood related needs..

Adjournment: There was a motion by Chuck and a second by Randy to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried.

Lord's Prayer: In conclusion of the meeting, Pastor led the group in The Lord's Prayer.


