Trinity Lutheran Church Annual Meeting January 25, 2015

The annual meeting was held immediately following church service on January 25, 2015. Chairman Tim Garrison opened the meeting and Pastor Koos led in devotions.

The minutes of the January 19, 2014 Annual meeting and the July 20, 2014 Semi Annual meeting were presented in the Annual Report. It was moved by Mike, second by Brad to approve the minutes as presented. Motion passed.

The next item of business was the presentation of the 2015 ballot. A motion was made by Kathy second by Gordon to accept the ballot as presented. Motion passed. Ballots were picked up and votes tallied.

The following reports were presented in the annual report: Pastor's report, Chairman's report, Treasurer's report, Memorial report. A motion was made by Brad, second by Steve to approve reports as presented, motion carried.

Old Business:

Roof: Has been completed, and should be good for many years. Video System: Has been purchased and been 100% donated. The cost is approximately \$10, 000 and should be installed in the next month or so, it will be 6' by 10' and will be a great addition to the Church. Husker women's basketball game, a signup sheet is in the entry way. Tickets will be \$4 for adults and \$2 for children.

New Business:

The 2015 Budget was presented in the Annual report and Tim went over some increases in the budget due to increase in visitation and pension. Brad made a motion to accept the 2015 Budget, 2nd by Mike. Motion passed.

A motion by Larry, 2nd by Steve to thank outgoing Council members and other elected members. Motion carried.

Church Pews: We will be looking at refinishing the pews as well as making some handicap assessable pews.

50th anniversary of the Church will be in July of 2016.

Church Library: We are currently looking for someone to upkeep the Church Library, contact Chris if you are interested.

By Laws and Constitution: It was brought to the Council's attention a couple months ago that the bylaws and constitution do not agree on some things. Pastor is working with one of his mentors to get this corrected.

Trinity Lutheran Church Semi-Annual Meeting July 26, 2015

Call to Order

The Semi-Annual meeting was held following the church service on July 26, 2015 Chair-person Chris Woerner called the meeting to order and Pastor Koos led in devotions.

Annual Meeting Minutes and Pastor's report

The minutes of the Annual Meeting were presented. There was a motion by Darin Mahloch and a second by Tim Garrison to approve the minutes as presented. The motion carried. The Semi-Annual Pastor's report was presented by Pastor Koos. See included.

Old Business

The first item of Old Business included discussion regarding the newly installed Video Screen which was purchased with donations.

The second item concerned the update on the church pews. Paul Radigan of Radigan Shottler indicated that refinishing the pews was not a practical option because of the veneer finish. He did provide an estimate of \$400 to \$500 for each handicapped seat. There was a suggestion by Joyce Holtmeier to consider reupolstery of the pews. Church pews will continue to remain on the Five Year Plan.

New Business

The first item of new business included an update on flood repairs. There were no serious damages to the church. The parsonage did have water in the basement. At the current time there is no longer seepage in the basement. A sealant will be applied to reduce the risk of further seepage. Currently approximately \$7,750 of the approximate \$10,000 insurance payment has been used for major purchases with some continued work to be done in the parsonage.

The second item of new business addressed the constitutional update process. Pastor Koos's mentor Rev Timothy Bernard has assisted in terms of providing input in regard to changes to comply with the requirements of the model constitution. The goal is to have constitutional updates to present to the congregation in September or October.

Use of the Suggestion Box was discussed. Input through the Suggestion Box is valuable. A reminder that all items must be signed to be considered by the council.

The social committee will be meeting to plan fall events and reported \$350 raised for the Back Pack program by the golf outing.

There was a motion by Duane Wollenburg and a second by Mike Holtmeier to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried.

The meeting was concluded with Pastor Koos leading the group in recitation of the Lord's Prayer.

Pastor Koos led off the meeting with a devotional.

Chris updated the congregation on the need for an updated constitution. Congregation has had access to the new constitution since mid-September.

Discussion was led by Chris and Pastor Koos to discuss significant revisions made in the new constitution:

- Quorum changes from 12 to 25 members
- Absentee ballots will be excepted for elections only
- Addition of an annual review for Pastor by the Church Council
- Addition of treasurer to Church Council
 - Congregation discussed the need for a job description for the financial secretary.

Tim Garrison moved to accept the constitutional provisions. Galen Plihal seconded. The congregation voted to pass the provisions. Next step will be to submit the constitution to Synod.

Brian Scherling moved to adjourn the meeting. Pam Garrison seconded. The motion was carried.

In conclusion of the meeting Pastor led the congregation in the Lord's Prayer.

Pastor's Report 2016 Annual Meeting

We've traveled far together in shared ministry these last 18 months. We've upgraded our technological capabilities with a screen/projector in the sanctuary and a new church website. We've enhanced our services with the addition of a Praise Choir and changes in the liturgy and communion practices. We've broadened our educational opportunities with the weekly Bible studies, parent study group, and enriched Sunday school and confirmation classes. We've deepened our connections through regular home and hospital visits. Indeed, we've traveled far together!

Though we've covered much ground, there is always more ground to cover. Our shared ministry is a blossoming blessing. Last year, we celebrated 14 baptisms, 6 funerals, 1 marriage, and the welcoming of 5 new members into our congregation. I was able to meet with 47% of our congregation through the home visits. These numbers are great but I'd like to see them increase in the year ahead (with the exceptions of the funerals). We will have a couple more new member classes in the spring and fall for those interested in joining. We have another wedding scheduled for September. I've made up a visitation schedule for this year and am looking forward to connecting or reconnecting with at least 60% of our congregation. We can grow in the use of our technology through my weekly "blog" postings and a monthly "movie night" in the sanctuary. Perhaps we'll try a new day/time for the Bible studies. There's definitely ministry to develop in our congregation.

Last year was a hard year for our community with the May/June flooding and August hail storm. Luckily the church didn't sustain any serious damage but the parsonage still needs some basement repairs and a new roof. Insurance and the DART committee have greatly helped in meeting these needs. Hopefully these two sources of assistance have helped in your need as well. Let us pray for a quieter spring/summer this year nature-wise.

Whether it's a bountiful year or a lean year for our congregation and community, we should be confident that God will walk with us through it all. I am reminded of Paul's words to the Ephesians (5:10), "Try to find out what is pleasing to the Lord." This year and all years we should strive to heed these words in our shared ministry.

God's blessings, Pastor Koos Greetings Fellow Trinity Congregation Members,

I would like to start out my report with saying that it has been a privilege and an honor to serve as your chair this last year as well as vice chair the previous year. I hope I have lived up to your expectations as chair this past year, it has been an exciting and tumultuous year for the congregation and greater community! If I recall correct, when Mr. Dave Hicks was serving on the call committee and inquired on if I'd be interested in serving as vice chair and chair for the congregational council, he stated don't worry; all the "big" projects (roof, sidewalk, etc.) will be done by the time you are chair and it will be easy sailing! I don't know if that was necessarily the case, but I still enjoyed the time I served.

Like the past few years, 2015 proved to be a bustling year for our church. Weather proved to be a challenge right away in my term as chair, as I think with Council's guidance we had to cancel church the second Sunday I held the title due to an early February blizzard. On a better note, in the early months of the year, we finished the video system project, the great majority of which was covered by a very gracious & generous donation. I am very pleased how the video system turned out and how it's helped to "modernize" our services. I think we are just on the cusp right now of figuring out how to use this upgrade to its fullest extent. (I thought about putting together a video montage of this last year's happenings, but ran out of time)

Things begin to get interesting for the council already in March when we were contacted by the synod attorney reminding us that our congregation had no effective constitution in place with the synod, and really needed to draft a new constitution more in line with the Synod's updated model constitution. This really got the ball rolling and council, with Pastor's guidance, began to take on the task of updating our constitution. This process has been time consuming and slightly frustrating at times. However, we feel that we've drafted an updated constitution that fits what our church needs and should soon be approved by synod and ratified within the first quarter of 2016.

I do not need to remind anyone of what the congregation and the greater community faced once May hit. Many people are still dealing with the repercussions of the flooding, and getting everything "back to normal" will be a long process. Fortunately, the church itself was largely spared from any major damage. Unfortunately the parsonage of course wasn't. Prior council's work though on insurance coverages left us in good shape to deal with the majority of damages incurred, but there is still some work left to be done. Spending more

time in the parsonage this past 8 months has also helped us see that our parsonage is in need of some pretty serious upgrading, changing many things out such as the windows on the main floor, and installment of an egressed window so pastor can have an official bedroom in the basement. I would also like to send a sincere thankyou to everyone who helped with the cleanup of our church and parsonage, as well as thank those in the congregation who spent countless hours doing just what Jesus taught us: helping our neighbor, especially in times of need.

There are a handful of projects started that should be finished up here shortly as well. Handicap pews are to be installed very shortly, and could possibly be done by the time our annual meeting comes. In December, we approved a contractor to get started replacing the hail damaged roof on the parsonage as soon as the weather warms. (Yes, more weather). There will be a lot of work to be done upgrading the parsonage as well in the upcoming years, a lot are things that Brian has helped to identify and will be working on with the council over the next year.

As I wrap up my term as chair, I would like to take a moment to thank all those who have served our congregation over the last year: fellow council members, WELCA committee, Sunday School Superintendents, Sunday school teachers, the circles, readers, choir & praise choir, church employees, and anyone else who helps to make this congregation a great one to worship with. I'd also like to thank Pastor Koos, he's been great to work with and has greatly helped me with my duties as chair. It's been great to see him grow and really come into his own the past 18 months as the leader of this congregation. I don't think we could ask have asked for a better fit for our congregation.

It has been a pleasure to serve you all this past two years, and I feel we'll be in good hands with the returning council members and of course the newly elected members as well. I can't wait to join this congregation in July to help celebrate the 50^{th} anniversary of our church's dedication.
