Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

November 18, 2015

I. Call to order

Chairman Chris Woerner called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on November 18, 2015. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Chris Woerner, Adam Wollenburg, Brian Nelson, Jane Stokebrand, Randy Wollenburg, and Chuck Holtmeier, and Darin Mahloch

II. Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was presented. It was moved by Chuck and seconded by Randy that the minutes be approved. Motion carried
- Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly report indicates a balance of \$11,849.98 as of November 18, 2015, Report was reviewed and approved.
- c) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- d) Memorial Report indicates a balance of \$18,713.56 as of this meeting date.
- e) Suggestion Box: One signed entry was received and discussed.
 - Roy and Peggy Scherling have requested that Bibles be available to worshippers. They are
 to be placed on the table at the back of the church.

f) Committee Reports:

- 1. Social Committee reported is to meet November 19th to plan upcoming events.
- 2. Worship Committee reported on attempts to conserve time during the communion service. Continuous communion has contributed to a decrease in service time.
- 3. Parish Education and Youth Group Ministries reported no concerns at this time.
- 4. Stewardship/Finance/Budget reported there will be a meeting January 7, 2016 to include Pastor Koos, Chris, Brian, and Jenn to update the budget

Property Committee reported bids by Innovations Siding and Window for repairs to the parsonage to include the options of steel gutters at \$2,380; aluminum gutters at \$2,040; and gutter guards at \$2,380. Also considered were window well covers as opposed to gutter guards. Brian also presented bids for three basement windows in the parsonage to be placed at an estimated \$2,550. Brian reported on a cracked window in the fellowship hall with a suggestion to replace the pane as opposed to the entire window. Brian will follow up on these items. Brian reported on estimates for the parsonage roof to include James Pittman Construction at \$14,000, MWR at \$16,000, and Curt Van Eperan at a cost of \$4,000 for labor with an estimated \$4,000 for product for an estimated total of \$8,000.

Old Business

- a) The first draft of the Constitution was returned with additional information provided by Attorney William Biggs. There were some additional updates since 2013 which were incorporated into the document. There was a motion by Darin and a second by Chuck to approve the changes. The motion carried.
- b) WELCA has offered to fund the purchase of handicapped pews to be installed by Ratigan Shottler. However, it has since been determined that the four pews can be funded by Thrivent Choice Dollars for a total of \$1,107.
- c) Discussion for replacement of paneling and shelving in the parsonage was discussed. This will be pursued through the DART project.

- d) A proposal by Richter's Heating and Cooling was presented to service the heating and cooling systems for both the church and the parsonage one time per year at a cost of \$495. There was a motion by Brian and a second by Chuck to approve this proposal. The motion carried.
- e) The Vitality Survey for the Synod was addressed. Council members will fill out the survey on line and Chris will compile the data.
- f) The Mission Share/ Benevolence for the upcoming year was discussed. There was a motion by Adam and a second by Randy to continue last year's amount of \$10,812. The motion carried.

III. New Business

- (a) Jordan Isaacson presented a review of property insurance coverage provided through Brotherhood Insurance. He provided an outline of coverage and offered options to be considered for the future.
- (b) Observation of the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation is scheduled to be observed in 2017. Volunteers for the planning committee are needed. Adam will discuss this event with the Worship Committee.
- (c) As discussed at the last meeting the Portico Benefits package for Pastor Koos was signed by Chris to remain the same as last year.
- (d) There was discussion regarding a possible contribution from Trinity Lutheran to DART. Further action was tabled to determine financial needs of DART.
- (e) Pastor Koos requested vacation time for December 28, 2015 to January 4, 2016. The request was granted.
- (f) It was noted by Brian that the west door of the church has sometimes remained unlocked following the Sunday service. It was decided to emphasize that information on the usher information letter.
- (g) There was a request from Camp Carol Joy Holling for funding to the Faithfully Forward Campaign regarding construction on the camp. The request will be posted on the church bulletin board.

Adjournment: There was a motion by Darin and a second by Adam to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried.

Lord's Prayer: In conclusion of the meeting, Pastor Koos led the group prayed the Lord's Prayer.
