Our congregation was asked by the synod to host a Chrism Mass ceremony for the bishop and other rostered leaders in our area. Thank you to all those who helped with the service and fellowship afterwards. Our bishop was able to experience firsthand how special our congregation is. Hopefully he'll be back in July to help us celebrate our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church being built.

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was presented. It was moved by Randy and seconded by Jesse that the minutes be approved. Motion carried
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly report was presented and approved.
- c) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- d) Memorial Report: This report was not available at this time.
- e) Suggestion Box: None
- f) Committee Reports:
  1. Social Committee reported plans for a trip to Nebraska Women's Basketball Game on February 14, 2016 at 3:00 P.M.
  2. Worship Committee reported the joint service with Soap Creek Church on February 7, 2016 with a joint praise service. The Ash Wednesday communion service will be held February 10, 2016. The services for lent will be held on Wednesday evenings at Trinity Lutheran Church with a light supper served at 5:30. Services will also be held on Thursday mornings at the DeWitt Methodist Church.
  3. Parish Education and Youth Group Ministries reported on increasing the children's participation in Sunday services. The Youth Group will participate in a movie presentation January 31, 2016 and will serve a Valentine Dinner after services February 14, 2016
  4. Stewardship/Finance/Budget was approved as corrected at the Annual Meeting.
  5. Property Committee reported regarding the ongoing pursuit of replacing the basement windows in the parsonage basement. Pittman Construction will begin the roofing project on the parsonage after April 1, 2016.

## **Old Business**

- a) An employee from Ratigan Shottler will be at the church Feb. 4<sup>th</sup> to begin work on pews for the handicapped. There was a motion by Randy and a second by Duane to install two handicapped accessible pews toward the front of the church and two in the back. The motion carried.
- b) There was further discussion of hosting a movie night one time per month for families to attend.

## **III. New Business**

- (a) There was discussion of the upcoming Fiftieth Anniversary of the church building. There will be a sign-up sheet for members who wish to be on the planning committee for that event.

- (b) Committees were assigned as follows: Worship is Adam; Parish Ed. is Joel and Jane; Memorial is Randy; Property is Duane; Social is Jesse; and Youth is Delva.
- (c) The communion assistance for the year were assigned (see included list).
- (d) The distribution of the monthly Newsletter was discussed. Members will have the opportunity to decline a paper copy distributed by mail and receive the letter by email. There will be further discussion regarding the feasibility of purchasing a postage permit.
- (e) There was discussion of receiving the monthly bank statement on line. Further discussion tabled for next meeting.
- (f) The Lenten services will begin on Ash Wednesday and continue through the season with Wednesday evening services based on the guided midweek sermons from Words From the Cross.
- (g) First Communion classes for fifth graders will begin on February 21, 2016 to continue for five weeks.
- (h) The Festival of Homolitics will be held in Atlanta in May. Pastor will investigate approximate costs to be presented at next month's meeting.

Adjournment: There was a motion by Adam and a second by Randy to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, Pastor Koos led the group praying the Lord's Prayer.
