My peers and I see the importance of continuing ministry on the SCC campus and I'm looking forward to ministering to that group of students.

# Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

July 17, 2016

### I. Call to order

Chairperson Brian Nelson called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on July 17, 2016. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Brian Nelson, Lois Wattjes, Joel Kaelin, Adam Wollenburg, and Randy Wollenburg.

# II. Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was presented. It was moved by Randy and seconded by Duane that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: No treasurer's report presented.
- c) Investments Report: A balance of \$34,709.14 was reported
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: Balance of Memorial Fund to date is \$16,700.54. This amount does not include reimbursement from Thrivent for the purchase of the Exmark mower.
- f) Suggestion Box: There were no suggestions submitted.
- g) Committee Reports:
  - 1. Social Committee will host a pool party Friday July 29, 2016 following Camp Noah.
  - 2. Worship Committee had no new report.
  - 3. Parish Education and Youth Group Ministries reported that Amber Koch is currently seeking Sunday School teachers for the upcoming school year.
  - 4. Property Committee reported lights in the fellowship hall will be replaced with LED bulbs. Duane also reported that the basement window on the north side of the parsonage has been closed in with block. This was completed by Chad Bissegger at a cost of \$350.

### III. Old Business

- a) The benevolence fund reported the amount donated during the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, excluding the farmer's market, to be \$16, 144. Following discussion there was a motion by Duane and a second by Joel to meet the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary goal of \$25.000 by using benevolence funds accumulated in the benevolence savings account to make up the difference. The motion carried. The amount of \$12,500 will be forwarded to both the Nebraska Synod Disaster Relief Fund and the Nebraska Lutheran Campus Ministry for the new center on the UNL campus.
- b) Following discussion it was decided that the bill from TruGreen for flea treatment at \$49.95 will not be payed from the Trinity Lutheran account.
- c) Culligan checked the systems of the water softening unit and replaced some o rings. In addition Pastor Koos has replaced a toilet valve in the master bath eliminating an unusual noise.
- d) The God's Work, Our Hands project was discussed. Pastor has received calls from Holy Cross Lutheran of Beatrice and American Lutheran of Filley about a combined "Teen Challenge" project to be held in Beatrice. The council was interested in pursuing this project to be held on September 11, 2016

- e) The purchase of benches for installation outside of the church was discussed. Duane reported a bid from Wilber Mfg. for metal benches for \$800 to \$850, and from Site Scapes for benches at \$1,200. There was a motion by Randy and a second by Lois to purchase two 8 foot benches from Site Scapes at a cost of approximately \$1,200 each. Delivery will be in six to eight weeks and Duane will handle the details. There was discussion of possibly adding plaques to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the church building.
- f) A copy of the letter to Roger Krivan thanking him for assistance in purchasing the Exmark mower was read to the group.
- g) Other old business included further action on a previous discussion regarding reimbursement transfers to Pastor Koos. Transfers will be provided twice monthly on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> of each month.

### IV. New Business

- (a) The upcoming confirmation class is expected to include 6 students in grades fifth through seventh.
- (b) The Semi-Annual meeting for Trinity Lutheran Church will be held July 24<sup>th</sup> following the regular Sunday service.
- (c) Other new business included discussion of the refrigerator in the parsonage which was not cooling properly. Pastor contacted Sears and they replaced the ice maker and reattached the fan blade which had come loose. The issue was corrected.
- (d) Additional other new business included information that Pastor has been contacted by Gina Weise regarding payment required for Camp Noah. Pastor will contact Gina for clarification.

Adjournment: There was a motion by Joel and a second by Randy to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, Pastor Koos led the group in praying the Lord's Prayer.

The next council meeting will be held on August 17<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 P.M. Communion Assistant for July 31, 2016 is Jane Stokebrand.


