Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

November 16, 2016

I. Call to order

Chairperson Brian Nelson called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on November 16, 2016. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Brian Nelson, Jane Stokebrand, Lois Wattjes, Joel Kaelin, and Jesse Gronemeyer.

II. Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was presented. It was moved by Lois and seconded by Jesse that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$7,416.05 as of October 31, 2016.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance is \$36,202.64.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: The memorial balance is reported to be \$45,147.94 with \$25,000 designated for capital improvements.
- f) Suggestion Box: None submitted
- g) Committee Reports:
 - 1. Social Committee reported no additional plans since the previous meeting.
 - Worship Committee reported the Children's Christmas program to be held December 18th at 5:30 in the evening with soup and cookies to follow. The Christmas Eve program to be held at 6:00 on December 24th.
 - Parish Education reported the next meeting of that committee to be held on the third Sunday of November. Youth Group Ministries reported plans to serve a meal at People's City Mission on November 27th.
 - 4. Property Committee reported the annual heating inspection indicated the need for repairs to the system at a cost of \$3,300. The project to install vinyl siding on the free standing garage at the parsonage at an approximate cost of \$2,000 continues depending on weather and volunteer availability. A dripping valve in the parsonage basement will be checked and repaired by a church member volunteer.

III. Old Business

- All end of year church reports need to be submitted early in January in preparation for the Annual Meeting.
- b) Sign-up sheets for ushers and greeters will be posted to allow volunteers to select dates convenient for them to serve.

IV. New Business

- (a) The loose offering for the first and second Sundays of Advent will go toward the Children's Christmas bags.
- (b) Donations to the Pastor's Christmas gift may be made until December 21, 2016.
- (c) Following discussion it was decided to continue to purchase the bulk postage rate at a cost of \$225 per year to cover mailing expenses.

- (d) There was discussion regarding the effectiveness of implementing E-giving. No decision was made.
- (e) The budget meeting for the 2017 church year will be scheduled for the first week in January.

Adjournment: There was a motion by Duane and a second by Jesse to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, Pastor Koos led the group in praying the Lord's Prayer.

Bible Study Questions Wednesdays, 8:30 a.m. February 2017

02/01/17 Matthew 5:13-20

- 1. What are some uses for salt? Leviticus 2:13; Exodus 30:34-35; 2 Kings 2:19-21; Job 6:6-7
- 2. What does it mean to be the "salt of the earth?"
- 3. What uses do you think Jesus was thinking of in our lesson? Vs. 13 (hint: Salt's main use in Jesus' day was as a preservative)
- 4. In Mark's version of the Sermon on the Mount in verse 9:49 he says that everyone will be "Salted with fire," what do you think he means by this?
- 5. How might you be like 'salt' in your neighborhood, in your family, in your workplace?
- 6. What is the principle that light teaches? Luke 2:29-32; John 1:1-9, 8:12, 9:1-5, 12:44-46; 1 John 5-10; Ephesians 5:6-8; Philippians 2:12-18
- 7. What does this concept mean to us as Christians? How does the light affect us?
- 8. In verses 14-16 the light is good works we do (*verse 16*), what are some of these good deeds? *Matthew 5:1-12*
- 9. How were the Scribes and Pharisees failing to be the salt and light of the world?
- 10. How does your desire to avoid being insulted or persecuted in some way hinder your living in a righteous way or following Jesus?

- 4. How do you "settle matters" with someone according to this passage?
- 5. Is Jesus putting resolution above worship in verses 23-24? How does this apply to the Lord's Supper?
- 6. What is the point of similarity between adultery and lust? 1 Corinthians 6:9-10; Colossians 3:5; James 1:13-15; Matthew 6:22-23
- 7. As we often do, Jesus used exaggeration to make which important point in verses 29-30?
- 8. What does this passage say about divorce, and is this still valid today? Why have we strayed so far from this teaching?

- 4. Imagine if you were there seeing this marvelous event; how would you have felt? What would you have done and said?
- 5. At this stage of Jesus' ministry, why do you think it is important for Jesus to hear these words from his Father?
- 6. Which is more important Jesus' identity or his activity?
- 7. How do you think the transfiguration affected the Disciples' faith and purpose?
- 8. Why did Peter want to build a tent? What would you have wanted to do?
