# ***Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes***

March 15, 2017

## **I. Call to order**

Chairperson Duane Wollenburg called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on March 15, 2017. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Lois Wattjes, Joel Kaelin, Brian Scherling, Yvonne Rahe, Byron Beerenstrauch, Cody Wollenburg, Jesse Gronemeyer and Amy Stokebrand

### Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. A correction was made to include how much the youth group was asking per child (\$146) out of the total amount (\$296) needed for the mission trip. Brian made a motion and it was seconded by Cody that the minutes be approved as amended. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$9,188.58 as of February 28, 2017. The available cash balance is \$2,649.62. Yvonne made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Jesse. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance as of January 27, 2017 was \$38,183.67. The balance as of February 24<sup>th</sup> is \$38,864.47.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: The memorial balance is reported to be \$18,807.09 as of March 15, 2017.
- f) Suggestion Box: None submitted.
- g) Committee Reports:
  1. Social Committee reported that they will be planning events once a quarter instead of once a month. The next event may be a summer cookout.
  2. Worship Committee finalized the Holy Week Services. Maundy Thursday service will be at 7:00 pm and Good Friday service will be 8:00 pm. It was encouraged to come to Lenten Services.
  3. Evangelical Committee reported that their focus will be to work on a New Member Packet to welcome new members and to reach out to families of the newly baptized every 6 months to a year to ask how they are doing and to encourage them to attend church regularly.
  4. Parish Education: It was reported that Vacation Bible School will tentatively be held June 19-23<sup>rd</sup>. Jana Muehling will be working to decide if days or evenings will work better.
  5. Youth Group: The Youth Group will be going on a Mission Trip June 25<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota. 9 students from our church, 2 students from the Methodist Church and 5 students and 2 adults from First Trinity Lutheran will be attending. They are asking the church to contribute \$146 each per student towards the \$296 total to cover expenses. The council felt that they should try to hold a fundraiser and wanted to know more details like what is the money that they are requesting going towards. The discussion was tabled until the next meeting.
  6. Property Committee: The Church cleanup will be held on March 25<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am. Projects to tackle will be cleaning the church windows, landscaping and sprinklers. Courtney's Lawn Service came to do the pre-emergence on the lawn.

## **II. Old Business**

- a) Pastor reported that the church is set up for the Thrivent E-Giving program. The \$100 enrollment fee was waived because we were enrolled by February 28th. There is a little training that needs to be done and Pastor and Jenn will look into this.
- b) It was reported that Jenn's hours as the secretary will be Monday and Wednesday 5-6:30 pm.
- c) The benches have been installed outside of the church.

### **III. New Business**

- (a) Steve Hovendick from Edward Jones reported on the church's investments. He felt that the investments are in good shape and to leave our allocations as they are for the time being.
- (b) The church will contribute \$100 to each confirmation student to attend Carol Joy Holling Summer Camp July 23-27. Jesse made motion and Yvonne seconded. Motion carried.
- (c) It was decided to hold a coffee before church to thank Barb Nelson for her years of service as the church secretary. Pastor will reach out to Barb and Brian to find a date that will work. We will give her a \$50 gift card as a thank you. Lois made a motion and Jesse seconded this request and motion carried.
- (d) Discussion was held about holding an evening service. Yvonne will bring it up at the next worship committee meeting to talk about format and details. Discussion was tabled until the next meeting.
- (e) There are 9 students taking the First Communion classes with their first communion during Maundy Thursday service.
- (f) We will renew our postage meter stamp for the upcoming year.

The council went into Executive Session. There was a motion by Lois and a second by Cody to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, the council recited the Lord's Prayer.

## **I. Call to order**

Chairperson Duane Wollenburg called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on April 19, 2017. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Lois Wattjes, Joel Kaelin, Brian Scherling, Yvonne Rahe, Byron Beerenstrauch, Cody Wollenburg, Jesse Gronemeyer and Amy Stokebrand

### Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. Brian made a motion and it was seconded by Jesse that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$3,522.92 as of March 31, 2017. The available cash balance is \$3,522.92. Brian made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Yvonne. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance as of March 31, 2017 is \$39,108.16.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: The memorial balance is reported to be \$18,808.38 as of March 31, 2017. There will be a deposit of \$400 into the Memorial Fund from the Schmohr funeral and then transferred to the general treasury to be used for general expenses as needed per the family's request.
- f) Suggestion Box: None submitted.
- g) Committee Reports:
  1. Social Committee had nothing to report.
  2. Worship Committee reported that they have some ideas for an evening service. They would like to see a congregational survey go out to see how much of an interest there is and ask for better ideas for times and what the congregation would like to see during an evening service with the idea of starting this in the fall. Easter Services were reviewed and finalized. It was suggested during the summer months to not introduce new music and to stay with the familiar hymns. They suggested it would be nice if the Sunday School Superintendent be invited to the meetings to help with planning.
  3. Evangelical Committee reported that they're working on gathering information about the church and drafting a welcome letter to mail out to parents of newly baptized babies and new members.
  4. Parish Education: It was reported that Vacation Bible School will be held June 19-23<sup>rd</sup>. Jana Muehling will be working to decide if days or evenings will work better.
  5. Property Committee: Courtney's Lawn Service came to do the pre-emergence on the lawn which is a slow release so it should be fine that it was applied a little early. There will be another application coming.

## **II. Old Business**

- a) The church clean up went well but the siding on the garage still needs to be done.
- b) Barb's appreciation coffee will be on April 30<sup>th</sup> at 9 am. It was decided who is bringing refreshments.

- c) We plan on sending out a congregational survey to ask about what is important to families in the church and the idea of an evening service. We are to work on coming up with questions to be included in the survey by the next meeting.

### **III. New Business**

- (a) The Youth Group raised \$60 at the Easter Breakfast with a matching donation for that amount for their mission trip to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Yvonne made the motion and Cody seconded it to give each Trinity Youth Member \$50 towards their expenses. Motion carried.
- (b) Pastor reported that all of our shut-ins are at the Wilber Care Center and they would appreciate a visit.
- (c) The new member class is starting with 2 families interested. Introduction will be May 14<sup>th</sup>.
- (d) It was suggested to publish a new photo directory. Pastor will visit with Liz Poessnecker to see if she is interested in doing it again.
- (e) Pastor goes to an Oblate retreat once a month on a Saturday but this year the annual meeting is in Duluth Minnesota from July 14-19<sup>th</sup> so he will be gone that week. We plan on doing a hymnfest the Sunday Pastor is gone. Because of that, we will hold the Semi-Annual meeting on July 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- (f) We will recognize the High School Graduates on May 7<sup>th</sup>.

There was a motion by Lois and a second by Joel to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, the council recited the Lord's Prayer.

**June 2017**

*06-07-17 Matthew 28:16-20*

1. We are being sent out into the world by the authority of Jesus. What areas of your life does Jesus have authority in and what areas does he not, and why?
2. How do you determine if Jesus has authority in your life?
3. Does Jesus have enough authority in your life to send you where he needs you to go and to do what he needs you to do?
4. Did Jesus give all believers a suggestion to go and make disciples or a command? What's the difference and how does this apply to you as a follower of Jesus?
5. Jesus commands all believers to go and make disciples. The word "go" can be translated "as you go". For you, in your life, where is "as you go"?
6. Jesus tells us how to make disciples: Sharing the Good News, baptizing those who respond, and helping them to mature in their faith. Do you feel prepared to do this? If not, what would help you to be prepared? What actions steps are you willing to take to become prepared?
7. What were some of the disciples doubting? How are Jesus' next words an antidote to this doubt?
8. What is the relationship between worship of God and witness for God? How is our witness for God a demonstration of our belief in the worthiness of God to be worshipped by all peoples?
9. What are some excuses that we make for not making disciples? What do these excuses reveal about us?
10. What are some legitimate hindrances to our task of making disciples? What are some practical ways that we can overcome these?

*06-14-17 Matthew 9:35-10:8*

1. When we consider the mission that God has called us to, whose example are we really following? Why is it important to always remember this?
2. What did Jesus' ministry look like according to 9:35?
3. When Jesus looked at the crowd, what was His response?
4. When Jesus sees that the people are like sheep without a shepherd, how does He direct his disciples to respond?
5. When we experience shortages in teaching God's ways, in proclaiming the gospel message that the Kingdom of heaven is near, and caring for and healing the sick and the diseased, how do we find workers for these tasks?
6. How did Jesus instruct his disciples to handle worker shortages?
7. Should we use recruiting practices for workers in the Kingdom's work? If so, what should they look like?
8. Apostle is an awfully spiritual sounding title; do you know what it means?
9. What were these men sent out to do?
10. How does their mission compare to Jesus' ministry?

*06-21-17 Matthew 10:24-39*

1. Tell of a time when someone "had your back." What difference did it make?
2. In verse 25, Jesus said, "If the head of the house has been called Beelzebul." Read Mark 1:34 & 39, Matthew 9:34 and 12:24. Who is the head of the house Jesus is referring to?
3. The meaning of Matthew 10:24-25 can be confusing. But Jesus' meaning can be summarized by completing this hypothetical (if . . . then) statement: "If Jesus himself is persecuted, being called

Beelzebul, then His students/disciples . . ." With the support of John 15:20, how would you complete this statement, and what does it mean for you today?

4. According to the Matthew 10:24-33, what are the three reasons we should not fear men, and do you find those reasons compelling? Why or why not?
5. Read Matthew 10:32-33. In light of the fact that a believer cannot lose his/her salvation, how can we understand these verses?
6. Re-read Matthew 10:28. In your opinion, what does it mean to "Fear the Lord"?
7. According to Psalm 25:12 and 14, Psalm 111:10, Ecclesiastes 12:13, Psalm 103:11 and Psalm 145:19, how do we benefit from fearing God?
8. Despite Jesus' injunction in Matthew 10:28 against fearing man, many believers struggle with all kinds of fears, which dramatically impact how effective we are for Christ. Read Psalm 34:4, I Peter 5:7, Joshua 1:9, Isaiah 41:10, Proverbs 3:5-6, Matthew 6:26-34, Isaiah 43:18-19, and summarize God's promises and commands to us, as it relates to fear.
