Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

May 17, 2017

I. Call to order

Chairperson Duane Wollenburg called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on May 17, 2017. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Lois Wattjes, Joel Kaelin, Brian Scherling, Yvonne Rahe, Cody Wollenburg, Jesse Gronemeyer and Amy Stokebrand

Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. Jesse made a motion and it was seconded by Yvonne that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$7,160.00 as of April 30, 2017. The available cash balance is \$5,489.44. Joel made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Cody. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance as of April 28, 2017 is \$39,669.47.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: The memorial balance is reported to be \$18,810.18 as of March 31, 2017.
- Suggestion Box: It was suggested to apply blue paint on the ramp by the handicapped parking on the east side of the church so no one can park on either side of the ramp because it doesn't allow a person to walk up the ramp if cars are parked on either side. The Council will look into options.
- g) Committee Reports:
 - 1. Social Committee had nothing to report.
 - 2. Worship Committee reported the agenda for Vacation Bible School which will be held June 19th-23rd from 2-4:30pm. There will be 7 stations for the children to work at. The committee is working on the Joint Community Worship for the 4th of July celebration which will be July 2nd this year.
 - 3. Evangelical Committee reported that they are working on baptism books to give to the parents. They are also looking at new member packets that might include the photo directory, cook book, welcome letter and a catechism book.
 - 4. Parish Education reported that the time has been determined for VBS and they are looking for volunteers. The Youth Group has finalized their Mission Trip. It was reported that Thrivent Financial will match the \$50 per member for the trip.
 - 5. Property Committee reported that the siding for the garage still needs to be put on. The sign in front of the church needs to be patched up. Received another invoice for treatment for the lawn from Courtney's Lawn Service.

II. Old Business

- a) A time for the siding to be put on was discussed. Looking at trying on Memorial Day if volunteers can be found.
- b) It was determined that Liz Poessnecker is willing to do the photo directory again this year. The Council thought the earliest it would be done would be in August based on Liz's schedule.

c) We plan on sending out a congregational survey to ask about what is important to families in the church and the idea of an evening service. A time was set for the executive members to meet and work on drafting this survey.

III. New Business

- (a) The joint service with St. Paul Lutheran (Soap Creek) Church will be on June 25th at their church.
- (b) The Synod Assembly will be June 2-3rd. Pastor, Liz Poessnecker and Bev Plihal will be attending.
- (c) The Barbershop Vocal group Pastor is a member of will be singing in place of a sermon on July 9th. There will be a freewill offering that day.
- (d) Pastor was approached about the church being used for a Peace Financial Class that is put on by the Dave Ramsey organization. It is a 7 week class and would just be held in the church. The Council would like more information.
- (e) The church letterhead needs to be updated. There was a quote from Arbor Ink that it would be less than \$50. Brian made motion and Jesse seconded it to go ahead and get this updated. Motion carried.
- (f) Welcome Inserts were discussed to be put in the pews for guests that tell a little bit about the church. Lois will look into getting a draft done for the next meeting.
- (g) Reimbursement of the \$100 that the church is contributing towards the fee to each of the confirmands that are going to the Summer Bible Camp was discussed. It was decided that a check will be sent directly to Carol Joy Holling closer to the camp date in July.

There was a motion by Brian and a second by Cody to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, the council recited the Lord's Prayer.

07-05-17 Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30

- 1. Jesus thanked His Father for hiding "these things" from the wise and prudent. What are some of the "things" He is referring to?
- 2. Who are the children that Jesus speaks of in verse 25?
- 3. How do you become a child in this way?
- 4. What place does wisdom and intelligence have in the things of faith?
- 5. In verse 27, Jesus said, "And no one knows the Father except the Son... How does a person come to know the Father?
- 6. In the Old Testament the rebellious Israelites were often accused of being "stiff-necked" by God and by His prophets? What comparison is being made and what does "stiff-necked" refer to?
- 7. What is meant by the words 'yoke' and 'burden' here in this teaching of Jesus?
- 8. You won't fully understand vs. 28, if you don't also take into consideration vs 29. What is the important demand or condition on the promise? Why is that important?
- 9. No one can find rest in Christ for his soul if he doesn't meet the conditions that Jesus also speaks about. So what are the 3 conditions?
- 10. How do these three conditions prepare us for discipleship?

- 1. In the story, what does the seed represent?
- 2. Which of the following are you most like, and why?

The one who receives the seed on the path

The one who receives the seed on the rocky place

The one who receives the seed that fell among the thorns

The one who receives the seed on the good soil

- 3. The one who received the seed on the hard path allowed it to be trampled upon and stolen away. In what ways are you hardened to the truth God is trying to plant in you?
- 4. In your life, how are you allowing God's word to be trampled upon or stolen away from you?
- 5. The one who received the seed on the rocky place experienced trouble and persecution because of God's word. How have you experienced this in your own life?
- 6. In the story, this person fell away because of shallow roots. How do strong roots help us to withstand trouble and persecution? What helps you to develop strong roots?
- 7. What does the good soil look like? What does the harvest/crop in this verse represent?
- 8. How does having a hard heart, no depth or too many worries crowd out God's ability to work in our lives?
- 9. The one who received the seed that fell among the thorns didn't fall away, but never matured in his faith and his life didn't produce fruit. This was due to the thorns in his life worries of life, deceitfulness of wealth, and desires for things other than God. 
