### Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

July 19, 2017

### I. Call to order

Chairperson Duane Wollenburg called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on July 19, 2017. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Lois Wattjes, Brian Scherling, Yvonne Rahe, Cody Wollenburg, Byron Beerenstrauch, Joel Kaelin and Amy Stokebrand

### Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. Lois made a motion and it was seconded by Cody that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$1,155.35 as of June 30, 2017. The available cash balance is \$863.95. Yvonne made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Byron. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance as of June 30, 2017 is \$40,364.71.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: The memorial balance is reported to be \$18,813.42 as of June 28, 2017. There will be another deposit of \$50 into the Memorial Fund from the Erdmann funeral and then transferred to the general treasury to be used for general expenses as needed per the family's request.
- f) Suggestion Box: There was a request to make a correction to the May 17<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes about the match by Thrivent Financial for the youth group mission trip. It should be corrected that it was a match from our church's Thrivent Choice Dollars.
- g) Committee Reports:
  - 1. Social Committee had nothing to report.
  - 2. Worship Committee reported the upcoming schedule for August. The 6<sup>th</sup> will be a Hymn Fest, the 13<sup>th</sup> will be the Praise Service, the 20<sup>th</sup> will be a normal worship service and the 27<sup>th</sup> will be a presentation by the Youth Group about the mission trip and communion. The Council will look into getting a supply pastor when Pastor Koos is on vacation for the future.
  - 3. Evangelical Committee reported that the Baptism packets have been delivered for the previous 2 baptisms.
  - 4. Parish Education: All felt that the VBS Presentation during service was very nice and it was nice to see what the kids did that week.
  - 5. Youth Group reported that 15 youth and 5 adults went on the Pine Ridge Mission Trip. They reported that they scrapped and painted houses, prepared meals and worked with children on the reservation. And the end of the week, they took in a little sight-seeing.
  - 6. Property reported that a quote of \$950 was received for fixing the sprinklers. It was decided to wait until next spring and decide. Brian is still looking at getting a quote for a pergola for the parsonage. The garage siding is about half done. Will set up another time to work more on it.

### II. Old Business

a) The Photo Directory was discussed since it has been over 5 years since the last one. Yvonne made a motion that we work with Liz to develop a new book this fall for a

separate one for Trinity Lutheran Church only and that any expenses will come from the Memorial Fund. Lois seconded the motion and the motion carried.

b) The council looked at the results from the congregational survey. A total of 218 surveys were mailed out with about 40 returned so far. We will table the discussion until we get more back.

### III. New Business

- (a) Pastor is looking at new devotionals. He brought samples for the council to review of the new devotionals called "Christ in Our Home". It was decided to try the new devotionals for the next quarter and we will review it after that.
- (b) Two confirmation students will be attending camp with Pastor in the upcoming month.
- (c) The Social committee will look into having a congregational picnic this fall.
- (d) Pastor received a letter from Immanuel Vision Foundation. There is a grant available to help churches in community outreach. After discussion, we would like to see a committee be formed to look at different ideas for a project in the community to see if the grant can help fund it.
- (e) Lois made a motion to release Courtney Broman and Tyler Krivan from membership per their request. Yvonne seconded and the motion carried. Joel made a motion to transfer membership for Kirk, Christa, Hannah, Carter and Sage Holtmeier to St. Paul Lutheran Church per their request. Bryon seconded and motion carried.
- (f) Brian made a motion to allow Pastor Brad to lead the service for Chris Badman's funeral per the family's wishes. Yvonne seconded and motion carried.
- (g) The Semi-Annual meeting will be held on Sunday, July 23rd.

There was a motion by Brian and a second by Cody to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, the council recited the Lord's Prayer.

Bible Study Questions Wednesdays, 8:30 a.m. September 2017

### 09-06-17 Matthew 18:15-20

- 1. Reflect on the concept of "church discipline" using the following questions: Does the concept conjure up in your mind loving and pleasant thoughts? Why or why not?
- 2. Have you ever witnessed the practice of church discipline in any church of which you have been a part? If yes, explain how discipline was carried out. If no, give reasons why there may be a failure in some churches to practice discipline. What is the purpose of church discipline?
- 3. In verse 15, Matthew writes, "If a brother sins against you." What is sin? Can we be offended by a brother without necessarily concluding that we have been sinned against? What is the difference between sin and those other offenses?
- 4. Does the thought of "sinning against you" include only those sins that have been directed at you personally? Explain whether it is possible to reason that a Christian who steals from Target sins against you?
- 5. What are some reasons why Christians are afraid to go and tell to other Christians how they have sinned against them? Which one of these reasons applies to you? How can you overcome these fears?
- 6. Is our failure to "go and tell" to others how they have sinned against us a sin? How is it a sin against God? Is this failure also a sin against "your brother" who sinned against you? How so?
- 7. What are some reasons why you should first go alone to your brother to confront him about his sin?

  How would you feel and respond if someone brought a number of people along to confront you about a sin you have committed against them?
- 8. Is it more loving, kind, gracious, or even more Christian to just forget it when someone sins against you? Why or why not? Why did Jesus not say, "If your brother sins against you, just forgive him and forget it?"
- 9. In verse 17, the text teaches that if the sinner "refuses to listen to" the witnesses, who have apparently agreed with the one bringing the charge, the third step in the disciplinary process is to "tell it to the church." What exactly should be told to the church? And who should do the telling—the sinned against believer, the witnesses, or all of the above? Does it matter? Why or why not?
- 10. What if the person in the process of being put under church discipline decides to leave the local church and join himself with another church, do we have any responsibility to warn that other church about the past situation? Why or why not?

### 09-13-17 Matthew 18:21-35

- 1. What would you do to celebrate if all of your debts were canceled?
- 2. Why did the servant promise to pay back the debt knowing that both he and the king would know that this would be impossible?
- 3. What is the value of forgiveness? Is this why we sometimes withhold it?
- 4. How can the realization of how much we have been forgiven by God help fuel our ability and willingness to forgive someone?
- 5. How does unforgiveness serve as a prison of sorts? What does holding on to a grudge do to a person?
- 6. Forgiveness is hard enough, but can we truly forget?
- 7. The king granted the first servant grace. Why?
- 8. How is the king's grace like God's grace?
- 9. Is there ever an occasion when we should not forgive?

10. Do we forgive others so God will forgive us, or does God forgive us so that we will have a forgiving attitude?
