# October 2017

Greetings from your pastor and partner in ministry!!

Fall is always an exciting time of year. The kids are hunkering into their studies, the leaves are changing, and the air gets a little crisp to it. The harsh summer temps are behind us and the harsh winter conditions have yet to rear their ugly heads. We're in the 'sweet spot' between comfort and anticipation.

Life around the congregation is in a similar sweet spot. The survey conducted over the summer revealed an overall satisfaction in our shared ministry with a few areas we can improve on. Our greatest area of concern was with our worship services. Last month we incorporated several changes that will hopefully alleviate some of the concern. The praise choir will not introduce any new songs this year and will focus on songs we've already sung in the last 3 years. The hymns will be much more familiar and worshipful. In an effort to focus my sermons, we switched from the Revised Common Lectionary to the Narrative Lectionary. Instead of the familiar 4-reading format (1st reading, Psalm, 2nd reading, Gospel), the new lectionary only has one extended reading. The readings lift up various voices from both the Old and New Testament that create a connected story. The Bible jumps around a lot and the Revised Common Lectionary tries to connect it through four readings. Often the RCL fails to make a connection so focusing on one extended reading each week allows for a cohesive story to unfold. Several Lutheran churches have adopted the narrative lectionary and they've grown to love it and I am confident our congregation will too.

Otherwise, we have a busy month ahead. We'll finish up our "catechism" series in which we've explored Luther's wisdom found in his Small and Large Catechisms as a means of celebrating the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation. I'll be attending the annual Barbershop choir contest in St. Louis on Oct. 20-22 so we'll have a guest preacher that Sunday. I've again invited Pastor Rick Johnson from Soap Creek to offer a Reformation message on the 29<sup>th</sup> and he graciously accepted. We'll host him and all our brothers and sisters in Christ from Soap Creek for a wonderful time of fellowship and joint worship. Pastor Rick and I will then get away for our synod's Fall Theological Conference on 10/30-11/01 being held at the Cornhusker Marriot in Lincoln.

The Reformation is often dated to October 31, 1517 in Wittenberg, Saxony, when Luther sent his "Ninety-Five Theses on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences" to the Archbishop of Mainz. This act created great debate in the Christian church which, in turn, birthed the Catholic and Protestant sects. The church was forced to rethink its practices and understanding of Scripture and became stronger and more representative of Christ and his love. Clergy will be celebrating the event in Lincoln on the 31<sup>st</sup> but I pray everyone takes a moment to give thanks during the milestone...in between trick-or-treaters of course!

# Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

August 16, 2017

### I. Call to order

Chairperson Duane Wollenburg called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on August 16th, 2017. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. ## Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. A correction was made to remove Jesse's name from members in attendance from the last meeting. Brian made a motion and it was seconded by Jesse that the minutes be approved with the correction. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$4,918.64 as of July 31, 2017. The available cash balance is \$2,439.40. Yvonne made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Cody. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance as of July 28, 2017 is \$41,051.86.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: The memorial balance is reported to be \$12,564.75 as of July 28, 2017.
- f) Suggestion Box: There was nothing to report.
- g) Committee Reports:
  - 1. Social Committee had nothing to report.
  - 2. Worship Committee reported that Sunday School will start September 10<sup>th</sup> and they will be using new material this year. Jana Muehling is the Superintendent with Josi Hoesche as the Assistant this year. Darcy Baker is the Sunday School Treasurer. The upcoming worship schedule will be a regular worship service on August 20<sup>th</sup>. The Youth Group will make their presentation on August 27<sup>th</sup> and on September 3<sup>rd</sup> will either be Praise Choir or Worship Service.
  - 3. Evangelical Committee will make an announcement in the newsletter and during service about the new pew cards. They are looking at following up with families that have recently had a loved one pass on and had the funeral here to see if they can help in any way.
  - 4. Parish Education: Jana is just getting the material ready for Sunday School and getting the number of children figured out.
  - 5. Youth Group will give a presentation about their Mission Group on August 27th.
  - 6. Property reported that they will be having another work session to get the siding on the garage finished.

# II. Old Business

- a) The Photo Directory was discussed with Liz. She hopes to set a schedule to take pictures starting on September 15<sup>th</sup> with pictures being completed by Thanksgiving. Appointments will be during the day and evenings. Members will have an option to buy their own directory if they choose.
- b) The council looked at the results from the congregational survey. The Executive committee will meet on August 23<sup>rd</sup> to review the results before they present to the congregation.

# III. New Business

- (a) Two confirmation students attended bible camp with Pastor. They learned a lot and also got to do some fun activities like horseback riding, fishing and boating. Pastor hopes more attend next year.
- (b) It was discussed to combine the congregational picnic with the Sunday School Potluck since it is hard to find another date that works for everyone. It will be held on September 10<sup>th</sup> after church on the lawn out front. Hot dogs will be provided with the congregation bringing side dishes. We will have games and homemade ice cream.
- (c) The Immanuel Vision Foundation grant was discussed with a grant available to help churches in community outreach. This will be passed on to the village committee that helped after the flood to see if there are any ideas for projects.
- (d) Pastor reported that there will be 10 new confirmation students this year bringing the total to 16 students. Confirmation class will be on Wednesdays from 6:30-8:00pm with classes starting on September 13<sup>th</sup>. There will be some new guidelines and rules this year and a parent of one of the students will be required to attend the class each week.
- (e) Jesse made a motion to release Becky & Kaelin Fuller, Kristin Brandt, and Lindsey and Micah Hofstetler from membership per their request because they no longer live around here. Yvonne seconded and the motion carried.

# 10-04-17 Exodus 2:23-25; 3:1-15; 4:10-17

- 1. Exodus says that the people groan and cry out, and God hears their cries, god remembers his covenant, God sees and knows their suffering. Do you think God hears everyone who groans and cries for help?
- 2. Exodus talks about slavery. Where does oppression and slavery exist today? What about more subtle forms of slavery? Or spiritual slavery? Who are some of our masters today?
- 3. God reveals himself to Moses in the burning bush. How does God reveal himself to us today?
- 4. What might it mean for us to "turn aside and see" so that we too might hear God's call?
- 5. How is God at work today to "bring good news to the poor, to proclaim release for the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, and to let the oppressed go free"?
- 6. How do you think God is calling you to be involved in his work of deliverance?
- 7. Why do Christians fail to believe what God is able to do through us?
- 8. In what area of your life is fear, doubt and ignorance keeping you from bearing significant fruit for the kingdom of God?
- 9. Why is God's statement to Moses in 3:12—"I will be with you..."—important for all Christians to grasp?
- 10. God calls and empowers His followers to be witnesses to both those that believe and those that do not. How has God worked through your own life to reach both groups?

# Hope Circle

Kathy mentioned that Soap Creek members will be invited to worship with us the last Sunday in October. Also, on November 5th Luther's Reformation will be celebrated. Shirley stated that we need to have a work day to organize the kit materials for Lutheran World Relief, as in November these will have to be boxed up and taken to Lincoln. We plan to meet on Monday, September 18th, at 9:00 am to do this. We may have to purchase some items to fill more kits. There was a discussion on providing blankets to send for LWR instead of tying quilts as we have done for years. These blankets would need to be at least 60x80 and could be new or used.
