We will have our monthly communion service in the morning and our traditional candlelight service in the evening. Come back on Christmas morning for another communion service. My family will be away on vacation from Dec. 26-Jan 02 so there will be our 3rd annual Christmas Hymn Extravaganza Service on New Year's Eve. We'll have plenty of holiday songs and cheer to celebrate the 12 days of Christmas.

Our Lord comes to us yet again and we rejoice in his coming. I pray you take the time to reflect on how he has blessed you in the last year and how you would like him to bless you in the year ahead. All things are possible with Christ!

Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

October 18, 2017

I. Call to order

Chairperson Duane Wollenburg called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on October 18, 2017. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Duane Wollenburg, Lois Wattjes, Brian Scherling, Joel Kaelin, Cody Wollenburg, Jesse Gronemeyer and Amy Stokebrand

Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. Lois made a motion and it was seconded by Jesse that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$1,898.08 as of September 30, 2017. The available cash balance is \$1,813.08. Joel made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Brian. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance as of September 29, 2017 is \$41,684.95.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report.
- e) Memorial Report: The memorial balance is reported to be \$12,134.51 as of September 30, 2017. The church received a memorial from the Roger Rahe family.
- f) Suggestion Box: There was a note that the 50th Celebration project still needs to be fulfilled. It was noted that our commitment has already been fulfilled.
- g) Committee Reports:
 - 1. Social Committee had no report.
 - 2. Worship Committee reported that Mandy Schmidt will also play the piano and organ for worship. The Children's Christmas Program will be Sunday, Dec. 17th at 5:30pm with a soup dinner to follow. Sunday School Superintendent Jana Muehling decided on the Christmas program called "New Star." Nov. 5th at 3:00pm will be a Mass Choir at St. John's Lutheran Church in Beatrice in celebration of the 500th year of the Reformation. A joint service with St. Paul Lutheran will be on the 29th with the children and adult choir along with communion. Thankoffering Service will be on Nov. 19th with Analee Schuerman leading. The Thanksgiving Community Service will be Nov. 19th at the Episcopal Church. The Christmas Eve service will be at 6:00pm and Christmas Day communion service at 10:00 am. Regular communion will be Dec. 31st.
 - 3. Evangelical Committee will send out follow up letters to visitors of our church.
 - 4. Parish Education nothing to report.
 - 5. Youth Group met and elected officers for the year and are looking at getting t-shirts made.
 - 6. Property committee reported that the insurance company requested a second bid for the AC unit project. Brian received the second bid and will forward to the insurance company so no action was taken until he hears if insurance will cover the unit.

II. Old Business

a) The Photo Directory was revisited to remind everyone to make their appointments to get their pictures taken soon. No pictures will be taken after Thanksgiving. b) The joint service on Oct. 29th with St. Paul Lutheran was discussed and Pastor Rick suggested that the loose offering go to the ELCA Disaster Relief Fund. Lois made motion and Cody seconded with the motion carried. Coffee and rolls will be served before church that morning.

III. New Business

- (a) It was decided that the Christmas tree will be put up and decorated on the first Sunday in December.
- (b) The church's computer's operating system was reviewed. The church's computer support system uses the standard Windows program for \$399 for 12 months of service. The premium support is \$499 for 12 months. Brian made a motion to continue to purchase the standard at \$399 and Jesse seconded. Motion carried.
- (c) A Pie Fundraiser was discussed with the funds to go to the Youth Group so Pastor will visit with Kelly Smith about getting this underway.
- (d) Discussed the new membership transfers for Jim Workman and the Jay and Jamie Weber family which includes children Paizley, Blakely and Maddox. Jesse made the motion to approve the new members and Lois seconded it with the motion carried.
- (e) Pastor reported that he goes to the First Lutheran Church in Wilber for Bible Study. He mentioned that it is very fruitful and informative and there is great opportunity for more members to attend if interested.
- (f) A discussion was held about the policies of the confirmation class and what is expected of each student to earn enough point requirements to be confirmed.

There was a motion by Brian and a second by Jesse to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. In conclusion of the meeting, the council recited the Lord's Prayer.

- 3. Does Mark's beginning create indifference in us or a sense of expectation?
- 4. How does this news compare to the news we see on TV every day?
- 5. Why is it important that the gospel began with prophecy?
- 6. What Old Testament prophecy did John the Baptist fulfill? Isaiah 40:3; Malachi 3:1
- 7. Given Malachi is the last book of the Old Testament, How does this opening of Mark's gospel affect our understanding of the relationship between the Old and New Testaments?
- 8. How does the baptism of repentance prepare the way for Jesus? Deuteronomy 30:19
- 9. Why do we need the baptism of the Holy Spirit? Why is it important to realize how the Holy Spirit works in us, with us and through us?
- 10. What expectations do you have of Jesus' coming?
