I. Call to order

Chairperson Brian Scherling called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on September 19, 2018. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. Mike made a motion and it was seconded by Deb that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$5,125.90 as of August 31, 2018 with available cash of \$1,160.23. Steve made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Karen. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance as of August 31, 2018 was \$54,934.50.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report. Pastor is working on the mural in the Nursey. He met with Pastor Rick at Soap Creek to work on the details of the Joint Reformation Sunday Service which will be October 28th. Pastor will be gone at a Theological Conference October 29-31st.
- e) Memorial Report: There was no report.
- f) Suggestion Box: There was a concern about the acolytes not serving correctly on communion Sundays. Pastor will remind the acolytes about the process.
- g) Committee Reports
 - 1. Social Committee reported that the Silent Auction raised about \$260 which will go towards the Sunday School. There are a few items left if anyone is interested.
 - 2. Worship Committee reported that Praise Service will be October 7th. Starting in September, Liturgy will now be setting 10 during worship.
 - 3. Evangelical Committee reported that a thank you was sent to our visitor during August.
 - 4. Parish Education/VBS reported that the Sunday School Kick off went good.
 - 5. Youth Group reported that the first meeting will be September 30th.
 - 6. Confirmation Committee reported that a mentor program will be starting with mentors for the 11 confirmation students.
 - 7. Property committee reported that the landscape project north of the Fellowship Hall is done. They will wait till spring to let the dirt settle before they landscape. Special thanks to Chuck Holtmeier, Jack Holtmeier, Brian Scherling and Mike Holtmeier for all their work on this project. Reported that the control panel and the wiring is bad in the bell tower so it will be looked at.

II. Old Business

- a) The Nebraska Lutheran Campus Ministry fundraiser has been planned for St. John's Lutheran Church in Beatrice.
- b) The Adult & Teen Challenge gave a presentation during our service. We will look into giving a donation of the offering from the joint service with Soap Creek.
- c) The locks on all the doors have now been changed so they all match with the same key.

III. New Business

- a) The Wifi connection does not reach to all the classrooms because of the distance. We received a quote of \$670 to fix this problem. We will table the discussion to see if there are other options.
- b) Rick and Terri Mangus are part of the Alter Committee and they would like to step away from these duties. We are looking for volunteers to take over these duties. A notice will be put in the bulletin and newsletter.
- c) Our vacuum cleaner does not work anymore. It is over 10 years old and we cannot get parts for it. Steve priced one for \$380 at S&S Sweeper Store. Mike made a motion to purchase a new vacuum cleaner for about \$380. Karen seconded the motion and the motion passed.
- d) Discussed that the Baptism plaque needs to be updated. Brian will work with Jenn on getting it up to date.

There was a motion by Mike and a second by Steve to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. The next meeting will be October 17th at 8:00pm. In conclusion of the meeting, the council recited the Lord's Prayer.

- 1. Do you see God as just a loving God? Do you view Him as a wrathful God? Do you see God as both loving and wrathful? How do you hold these two characteristics in tension? (1:3-5)
- 2. What was the message for Samaria and Judah? Why is God coming down from the heavens?
- 3. Why is idolatry a sin?
- 4. Why does Micah begin his prophecy with Samaria?
- 5. Why do you think God would give such a large role to such a small village? (5:2-5a)
- 6. Why do you think Micah used both the ancient (Ephrathah) and modern name (Bethlehem)? *1 Chronicles 2:50-51*
- 7. Think outside the box. What are some reasons that Micah might have used the character of the shepherd to describe the coming Messiah, especially when shepherds were seen as third class citizens?
- 8. Why is showing mercy so difficult? How does it feel to be shown mercy? (6:6-8)
- 9. What does it mean to be a disciple, a follower of the living Christ?
- 10. Can you identify any form of violence and injustice in your own context?

- 8. How does Hezekiah rightly interpret the TRUE nature of the attack?
- 9. What is the work assigned to Hezekiah by God to deal with this attack?
- 10. What does Isaiah see happening in this period known as "the days to come" (i.e.; this period which is the New Testament era?)
