October 17, 2018

I. Call to order

Chairperson Brian Scherling called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on October 17, 2018. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Brian Scherling, Mike Holtmeier, Nate Morrissey, Steve Garrison, Deb Schwan and Amy Stokebrand

Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. Mike made a motion and it was seconded by Nate that the minutes be approved with a correction. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$5,291.30 as of September 30, 2018 with available cash of \$5,291.30. Steve made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Mike. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: The investment balance as of September 28, 2018 was \$54,665.05.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report. The SCC Campus Ministry Fundraiser will be held at St. John's Church in Beatrice. The Reformation Joint Service will be October 28th at 10:30 at Soap Creek. Offering will be going to the Adult & Teen Challenge in Beatrice. Birthday and Anniversary greetings will be sent out to all members. The council decided not to allow the Sunday School students to wear pajamas to church. Pastor will be on vacation November 25 and December 30. We will look at getting a supply Pastor for November 25th. All Saints day will be Sunday, November 4th. Pastor will send out notices to all the families.
- e) Memorial Report: There was no report.
- f) Suggestion Box: The council received a note that the outlets in the meeting room trips the breakers so we were asked for it to be looked at when someone comes to look at the Bell Tower. It was suggested that we look at a lift to make it up to the choir loft to make it easier for members to sing or worship up there. A suggestion was made to move the Sunday School classes during the church services to get more people to attend services. Nate will take this idea to the Parish Ed to see if there is any interest. It was suggested that confirmation be moved to the Sunday after Halloween so kids can trick or treat.
- g) Committee Reports
 - 1. Social Committee reported that there are still a few items left from the Silent Auction if anyone wants them.
 - 2. Worship Committee had no concerns for the Council.
 - 3. Evangelical Committee had nothing to report
 - 4. Parish Education/VBS had nothing to report.
 - 5. Youth Group reported that Pie Sales will begin November 1st and go thru the 15th. Also reported about the planned activities for the year.
 - 6. Confirmation Committee reported that everything seems to be on track and will continue to monitor the Mentor program throughout the year.
 - 7. Property committee wanted to also thank Brian Schmidt for his help with the landscape/drainage project. It was reported that squirrels have been getting into the church thru the roof and then out into the Care-a-lot room. Three squirrels have been caught so far in live traps. The hole has been repaired temporarily but will need to be worked on. We are waiting for Tim Garrison with Plymouth Electric to come out about the Bell Tower. A new vacuum cleaner has been bought and seems to be working well.

II. Old Business

- a) The quote came in for the Wifi update but we will wait on this project.
- b) Suzie Miller has volunteered to be a part of the Altar committee to change out the linens and banners.
- c) We will wait to make our Benevolence payment at the end of the year.
- d) The Baptismal Plaques have been updated and will be the responsibility of the Parish Ed committee from now on.

III. New Business

- a) The Executive Committee will meet to discuss the Pastor's six month review.
- b) It was discussed to do a signup sheet for next year for the Usher/Greeter lists so that people may sign up for the months that work better for them.

There was a motion by Nate and a second by Mike to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. The next meeting will be November 14th at 8:00pm. In conclusion of the meeting, the council recited the Lord's Prayer.

1. What does "... know that the Kingdom of God has come near," mean to you?
2. What comes to mind when you hear, "...stand before the Son of man?"
3. What are the "leaves" that signal the nearness of the Kingdom?
4. Why is it important for us to be aware of the signs of the coming Kingdom?
5. What are the pitfalls we face when we fail to have an eternal perspective on life?
6. How are you prone to be preoccupied with life and circumstances that marginalize Christ?
7. What does it mean for us as a church family to be watchful?
8. In what ways do we live as a church family that is prepared for the return of our King Jesus? Where do we need to get things ready that have been left in disarray?
9. How does this message challenge us to love one another and love our neighbors?
10. What application should be made to those who claim the previous verses predict Jesus' final return?

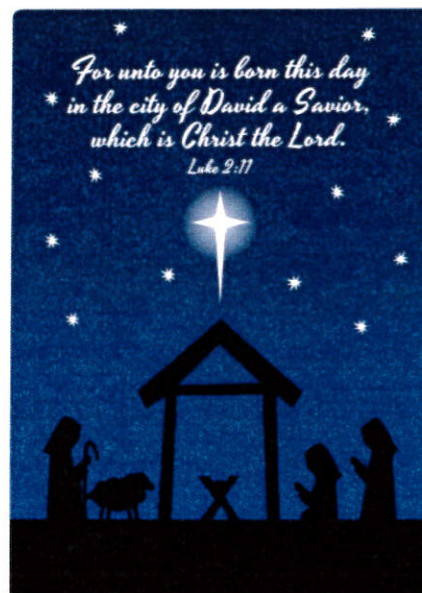

This reminds us that Jesus who came in the flesh will return on the last day from the sky to which he ascended. The crown on the altar hanging reminds us that Jesus is our King. The word, "Emmanuel" means God with Us. The banner also has a blue background and a representation of the four candles which represent the four weeks of Advent.
