Trinity Lutheran Church Minutes

December 18, 2018

I. Call to order

Chairperson Brian Scherling called to order the regular meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church Council on December 18, 2018. Pastor Koos led the group in devotions. Members in attendance were Pastor Koos, Brian Scherling, Steve Garrison, Nate Morrissey, KarenWollenburg, and Yvonne Rahe.

Reports

- a) Secretary's Report: A copy of the previous minutes was reviewed. Nate made a motion and it was seconded by Yvonne that the minutes be approved. Motion carried.
- b) Treasurer's Report: A copy of the monthly treasurer's report indicated a balance of \$2,288.33 as of November 30, 2018 with available cash of \$2,138.23. Brian explained that a check was written out for \$125.00 to a supply Pastor for the Sunday of November 20, 2019, but church was cancelled due to weather so check amount has since been reimbursed. Steve made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Nate. Motion carried.
- c) Investments Report: No Report.
- d) Pastor's Report: See included report. Pastor shared he is currently doing some prison ministry with a non-member individual that was requested of him. Pastor will be attending the Middle School Gathering on January 19th & 20th in Kearney along with 6 youth from our congregation.
- e) Memorial Report: There was no report.
- f) Suggestion Box: There was nothing to report.
- g) Committee Reports
 - 1. Social Committee had nothing to report.
 - 2. Worship Committee discussed and revisited all the activities for "Advent Surprises" for each Sunday of December. Karen also reviewed the Christmas holiday service times.
 - Evangelical Committee reported finding the Trinity picture postcards that can be possibly be used to send out to visitors. Yvonne will check with post office if they can still be utilized.
 - 4. Parish Education/VBS reported that a Sunday School Superintendent nomination name has not yet been found.
 - 5. Youth Group had no report.
 - 6. Confirmation Committee met in November and reported that the program seems to be going well with the new restructuring and mentor program.
 - 7. Property committee reported that all paperwork was turned into insurance for Bell Towner repairs and we have received the insurance payments. The first down payment has been sent in and work will begin in February/March to repair bell and install new control panel.

II. Old Business

a) Brian has been reviewing some more of the "Wedding Cleanup" protocol that is handed out to couples wishing to be married at Trinity. Two items on it were discussed more and it was decided to table this matter for the new Council in January.

- Our Benevolence commitment of \$11,000 for 2018 will be completed by the end of December.
- c) A new company would like our business for our copier maintenance. Our current contract runs thru September 2019 so this was tabled for later.
- d) Brian reminded us that December 21st is the deadline for turning in monies for Pastor's Christmas gift.

III. New Business

- a) Nate made a motion to accept the transfer of Jim & Denise Miller's membership to Cornerstone Church in Beatrice. Yvonne seconded the motion and the motion passed.
- b) Brian will get together with Mike on taking down of the Christmas tree.
- c) The annual meeting will be moved up a week to January 13, 2019 after church services due to Pastor attending the Middle School Gathering. End of year reports will be due January 4, 2019 in preparation for the annual meeting.
- d) The Council executive committee and Jenn will be meeting Sunday, December 23rd at 8:00 am to plan the 2019 church budget.
- e) The nominating committee of Cara Heller, Larry Pieper, Connie Scherling and Eldon Stokebrand have begun their work on a proposed 2019 election ballot.
- f) Installation of all newly elected church positions will be Sunday, January 27, 2019 during the church service.
- g) The first meeting for the 2019 Council will be Wednesday, January 30, 2019.
- h) We still need people to sign up for being ushers and greeters in 2019.
- i) Brian thanked all Council members for their support and help during this past year.

There was a motion by Nate and a second by Steve to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. The next meeting will be January, 30, 2019 at 8:00 pm. In conclusion of the meeting, the council recited the Lord's Prayer.


