## Bible Study Questions Wednesdays, 8:30 a.m. September 2019

### 09-04 Genesis 2:4b-25

- 1. Have you previously noticed that Genesis contains two creation accounts? What are the different (but complementary) messages that they communicate?
- 2. What is the full implication of God being given a name (Lord/Yahweh) in chapter 2? How does this differ from other religions and/or worldviews?
- 3. How does humankind differ from other parts of creation? What does it mean to be a living being?
- 4. If God breathing life into us means that we are able to relate and serve him, how can we do this?
- 5. While we are given much freedom, it is clear that humankind is also accountable to God. Do you think Christians find it hard to submit to God's authority?
- 6. What is the expectation of man in the garden? Take some time to explain both responsibilities described in verse 15.
- 8. How do these verses remind us of the dignity of all work? (Reading vv.1-3, you might also like to reflect on the implications for rest.)
- 9. How does the joining of man and woman honor God and enable humanity to flourish?
- 10. Why do you think that marriage is so important in the Bible and the ultimate symbol of Christ and the Church?

## 09-11 Genesis 18:1-15; 21:1-7

- 1. What does this story teach us about Abraham's character?
- 2. Why does Sarah laugh to herself, and why do you think she then lied about it?
- 3. When our prayers are not answered the way we want, what are our typical responses? Why?
- 4. Did Abraham know that he was showing hospitality to the LORD at first? Why is hospitality so important?
- 5. Who should we show hospitality to? What should we do to be ready to show hospitality?
- 6. Is anything too hard for the LORD? What difference should the answer to this question make in your prayer life? What difference should the answer to this question make as it pertains to your trust in the promises of God?
- 7. Who were the visitors? What was Sarah promised?
- 8. What does this story tell us about the meaning of marriage?
- 9. What does this story tell us about the meaning of family?
- 10. What does this story tell us about God?

## 09-18 Genesis 32:22-30

- 1. In v. 22, Jacob continues to send everyone and everything in front of him. How do you think this reflects on his character?
- 2. In v. 23, a mysterious man shows up and begins to wrestle Jacob. This is not a turn most of us would have predicted. Why do you think this is a fitting twist to the story?
- 3. The mysterious man disable Jacob to stop him from wrestling, but he does not heal his wound. Why do you think the man disables Jacob, and why doesn't he heal him afterward?
- 4. The man renames Jacob, "Israel" because he had "struggled with God and with humans and have overcome" (Israel literally means, "wrestles with God"). Jacob lost the match, so in what way did he overcome?
- 5. "Israel" would come to be used as the name for all of Jacob's descendants, and can even apply to those who are "grafted" into that family through Jesus (Rom. 11:24). Why do you think that is significant? What does it tell us about the sort of relationship God values?
- 6. This passage does not identify the man as "God." But, Jacob concludes that it is God, why?
- 7. What benefit was God seeking to impart to Jacob when He injured Jacob's hip? (vs 25)
- 8. In what sense did Jacob "prevail" over the Angel of the Lord (vs. 28)? How do we "win" in our struggles with God?
- 9. Why does the Angel of the Lord refuse to discuss His name (vs. 29)?
- 10. Have you ever "wrestled" with God? About what? What was the outcome?

## 09-25 Exodus 1:8-14; 3:1-15

- 1. Do you think the king of Egypt was justified in his thoughts about the Israelites? Do we see parallels in our own society and immigration policies?
- 2. Does the Bible condemn slavery? How should Christians respond to the fact that millions of people around the world are slaves even today?
- 3. What is significant about the new king's lack of knowledge about Joseph? (read Gen 47:1-10 & Gen 50:1-11)
- 4. Explain the seemingly contradictory (at least to me) statements by the new Egyptian king "they are too many and too mighty for us" and "Therefore they set taskmasters over them and afflict them with heavy burdens".
- 5. Considering Moses life, what can we learn about Gods time tables for our lives?
- 6. What would have happened if Moses had become impatient and decided to do something different, as opposed to waiting on God? (Rom 15:4, 2 Cor 6:4, Col 1:11, 1 Th 1:3)
- 7. Who else was a Shepard when God placed a call on his life (2 Sam 7:8)
- 8. Considering the educational level of Moses, what can we learn about his humility in waiting for God?
- 9. What can we learn about the character of God and our requests of Him? a. What requests can we take to God, and which ones should we try to handle on our own? (Phil 4:6) b. Will God answer all of our petitions? (Rom 8:28)
- 10. Define the word Oppression. Why is God concerned with His people being oppressed?


