Greetings in Christ this March!

Here, in my monthly column, I like to give my thoughts on what is going on, what I'm seeing, what I'm thinking, and I welcome your feedback at any time.

When I was 12, my family went on vacation to Colorado in the mountains. The best part of that memory for me was an Alpine Slide. If you're not familiar, you sit on a low-riding cart on a cement track with raised edges to keep the cart on it. The track winds its way back and forth down the mountain. You have a handle that brakes the cart, and that is it. You take a lift to the top of the track and then you ride on your cart on this weaving track all the way down to the end, and it... is... a... blast! I remember the emotional hangover that I had when we were done. Like Christmas being over. My dad bought a double ride pass for all of us, and still, at the end I wanted to go on it again. I still do now.

Recently, at one of my Clergy text-study groups that meet on Tuesday mornings, we got to talking about some of the anxiety present in churches nowadays. We started using the metaphor of an Alpine slide ride and how maybe the church has come to the end of an exhilarating ride. It's not a perfect metaphor, but I love metaphors and I take them for what they are. Let me attempt to explain how we worked it out. Tell me if you agree.

During World War II, we were climbing the mountain. It was difficult work. There was a lot climbing over obstacles, a lot of sweat equity poured into our dream of getting to the top. There was a lot of sacrifice made in pursuit of the goal of overcoming evil. And then when the dream was finally realized and the war was over, that was when we reached the top. We had made it.

We were looking for what to do next. Enter the church - our alpine slide cart. The church was ready - built for this. Church became the vehicle for realizing the payoff of all the hard work and sacrifice made by the generation that had gone through the recent war. And it was incredible! The work paid off! For the next 60 years, the church was the beneficiary of it all. What a wild ride! Sunday schools were full to overflowing where our children learned the story of God's love for them. People found a place that would minister to them for their whole life, from baptism to marriage to funeral. Communities revolved around their church.

The church was doing amazing work! And it was an amazing ride. Is that ride now coming to an end? And if so, what does that mean for the church?

I think that the ride has finished in so many ways, and that's what we talked about. Again, the metaphor isn't perfect, but the ride that began for the church after WWII is slowing down, losing its momentum because we're no longer in a place where gravity is doing the work for us. And for the members of the church who lived it, loved it, believed in it, benefitted from it, the emotional hangover is daunting. The joy that came from being in the nexus of community was powerful.

And so now the church is asking a question for the first time in a long time. What do we do now?

I'll continue with the metaphor. It turns out that the church comes equipped with an engine. We haven't had to use this engine while gravity has been carrying us down the mountain. Maybe, we're even to the point where generations have come and gone, and no one is really sure what we need to do to turn it on.

As a pastor, it certainly feels to me like we are rediscovering something as a church, as a people of God. I'm seeing more and more of an interest in the Bible as more than just a collection of stories about Jesus. It's more than just a love letter from God to his creation telling them how much he loves them. It's more than a rule book telling us how to live our best life. Don't get me wrong. It is all of those things. But it's more.

Finishing out the metaphor, this is the engine. Our mission, our purpose, our calling as the people of God - that is what will drive us forward in the absence of gravity assist. And what is our mission? It is the same one that God gave to Abraham. It is the same one that Jesus completed for us when the people of God couldn't figure it out. It is to bless the world in the name of God so that the world might know God again.

That, after all, is God's dream. The Bible tells us that the world is messed up. We messed it up. And because we messed it up it wasn't safe for us to be in God's presence, and that broke God's heart. God's dream is to dwell among his people again, like he did as it was portrayed in the Garden of Eden narrative. And scripture is the story of what God did, the lengths to which God went to restore what had been broken.

Our mission is hard work. It is not as much fun all the time. So, it is harder to envision that people will jump on board as quickly or easily with such a mission. And that's not how we should be advertising ourselves anyways. People have grown disillusioned with a church that is promising ease and good feelings all the time. Grace was a word used so often by the church for the past 60 years that it has kind of lost its meaning. But one thing is still clear. It is easy to see that the world is broken, that we messed it up. And what people are looking for now is a way to work together with God and with one another to restore what has been broken.

There is still plenty of work for the church to do. The church is not obsolete. We don't have to pack it up and go home. The church is in need of good leadership that can figure out the engine compartment, that can pop the clutch and get it churning again. We can learn to speak the language of our faith in an honest and vulnerable way.

We're still working it out. But it is work worth doing.




