Does the Bible have something to say to us during the COVID-19 pandemic? How do we feel about our faith during times like this when we are out of control in ways that we normally do not experience?

I've been thinking a lot about this question, and I've been seeing the responses of various communities as to how they are treating their faith during this time, and it is a fascinating thing to observe. Here's some of what I'm noticing.

I'm noticing that we aren't used to this anymore. We are not accustomed to being out of control, to being put in our place as a human race. It was a gradual thing that happened over time, this attitude that developed. But it showed itself to me when I happened across an article from a newspaper covering a church anniversary of some 75 years ago. In that article it mentioned the agricultural activities of the community, and I remember vividly the language that was used. It spoke of "wresting from Mother Earth her stores of wheat and grain." There was other similar language used, but that's the portion that stuck with me. For all of history, it was a chore to work the ground, a labor, and the effort required was often a high price to pay. Now I'd grown up in the time where heavy machinery was putting much of that in the past. We had developed means to address much of the risk and the threat of farming. It was not perfect by any means, but it was a far cry from what it used to be for the entirety of the world's history. We were maximizing production and minimizing workload. And to look around even further, I was living in an age where virtually anything I wanted (that I could afford) was available to me at the click or tap of a screen.

Do you know what I'm talking about? We had gotten to the point where we might have thought that the world was tamed. We could certainly fool ourselves without much effort into thinking that we had the world under control. I know that there are those times when hurricanes remind us of how powerful the world is, or tsunamis show us the destructive power of the elements. The tornado that tore through Wilber back in 2005 was horrible and the hailstorm of 2014 left us with things to rebuild. But we'd gotten better and better at handling those moments. The world was largely our servant, our resource, our domain. And then this.

I think in many ways we have been humbled by our own limitations, reminded about just how human we truly are. The challenges we're facing cover a wide range of disciplines including the health fields, our political fields, our scientific fields, our economic fields, our community fields, most any field of life. We cannot rely upon our own reason or strength at the moment.

This kind of a world, the kind where we don't know what to expect, where we don't know who to trust, where we are looking for answers to why the world is so messed up, is the world of the Bible. Think of what the world itself must have been like before 100 years or so ago and the dawn of the Industrial Revolution. The world has changed so much since for us in the past century as to what we are capable of, but before that, the world didn't change all that much. That world was predictably unpredictable, unkind, and unforgiving in so many ways, and the gods that the world worshipped reflected that reality.

Into such a world, our God speaks a refreshing word of hope. The Bible says no less than 365 times, in some form or another, to "not be afraid." The Bible showcases a God who created all things "good" and who comes to the rescue of the world when we break it and we harm ourselves. The Bible speaks into a world in chaos a commentary on how we got ourselves into this mess, how we continue to take for ourselves at the expense of others, and how God responds when we do.

There are some very interesting details as well when it comes to Sabbath practices as laid out for the people of Israel when they come into the promised land. We never spend time on these anymore, either teaching them or observing them, but they were called to allow the land to rest every 7th year. The land was itself a character in such a scenario. They were not to plant or to harvest every 7th year. That was crazy! Why would God command such a thing? The warnings connected with that practice were severe, that they would lose the land if they did not abide by those commands. For them, the exile to Babylon was in many ways connected to their failure to allow the land to rest after being reminded over and over again, because they did not keep sabbath faithfully.

I am not at all making a direct comparison here, not at all saying that COVID-19 is our own fault for failing to keep any part of God's commands to us, but the parallels are interesting to ponder and hard to ignore. There are parts in the Bible that mandate for periodic and scheduled rest for ourselves AND for the larger creation, and they are vital elements in the Bible story. And here we find ourselves in a forced rest. We are learning in real time that we need each other in every way imaginable. The Bible teaches us this. We are reminded that death is a part of the world we live in. The Bible has dealt with this at length. How long will this last? Only God knows. The rest for the land at the time of the Babylonian Exile was about 50 years. This one ... probably ... won't be that long.
